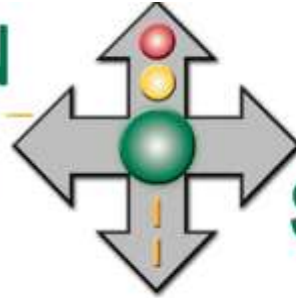

## Driving and Traumatic Brain Injury

How can a traumatic brain injury affect my driving abilities?

- Impaired physical skills
- Decreased visual attention
- Slowed information processing
- Increased frustration/confusion
- Decreased multitasking/divided attention
- Inconsistent performance
- Poor decision-making and/or judgment

Warning signs to look for:

- Not noticing signs, signals, or other traffic
- Needing help or instructions from passengers
- Getting lost or confused
- Driving at inappropriate speeds
- Making careless or reckless decisions
- Accidents or near misses
- Blaming mistakes on other drivers
