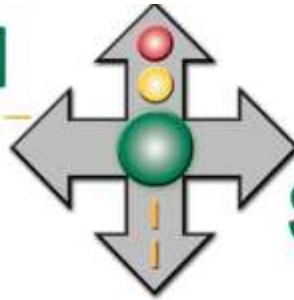

Driving and Cerebral Palsy

How can Cerebral Palsy affect my driving abilities?

- Limited range of motion and strength
- Decreased coordination
- Exaggerated startle reflex to loud noise
- Visual impairments, especially acuity
- Difficulty with visual scanning and/or tracking quickly and smoothly
- Cognitive impairments
- Impaired judgment and decision-making in complex or new situations
- Slowed information processing
- Slowed reaction time

A Certified Driving Rehabilitation Specialist can complete a driving evaluation to help identify strengths and areas of need for an individual driver. Recommendations can be made to help promote safe, independent driving.
