


ALEXANDER GLASS (b.1992) is a Sculptor living and working in London. His work explores the tense relationship between the ideas of masculinity and desire through the re-presentation of iconic imagery that speaks of the potent male body. Recent shows include 'Notes on Queerness' - The Royal Standard - Liverpool & 'A Body is A Building' Bloc Projects Billboard Commission - Sheffield. Glass is a graduate of the Royal College of Art's MA Fine Art Sculpture programme in 2017.

JAMES WILLIAM MURRAY (b. 1988) develops interrelated questions of desire, corporeality, and materiality through a range of minimal strategies. All works emphasise the body, human touch, and figuration as points of departure. He received an MA in photography from the University of Brighton in 2015 and has exhibited in the UK and internationally. His work is in the collection of the Hellenic Centre For Photography and private collections throughout Europe. In 2016 he co-founded the studio and project space Niagara Falls Projects in Brighton UK. In 2018 he was awarded the Sussex Open Commission by Towner Gallery UK and the patrons of Eastbourne Arts Circle. He is represented by Stephane Simoens Contemporary Fine Art in Knokke-Heist, Belgium. 
























Glass/Murray, *Bits of Broken Boy, 2018* copper leaf on feather pillow, paraffin wax 70 x 50 x 15 cm

## Alexander Glass A Dream of Apollo

Summer, I wake in heat. My body radiates and perspires, needs to be showered. Stretching, sat up on my bed I watch myself in the long mirror being sure to make the most of any definition I can find. This pleases me, the knowledge that my body suggests a man, that with passing days it clenches and firms, revealing what is hard underneath layers of soft. A body in progress, a body as an ambition, a body as an image, reflected.

I have taken countless images of my own body, but they rarely satisfy. It exists as a comparative to a standard and an ideal within my own mind. In the minds of many perhaps. Not so elusive, the image is everywhere. In priaptic impulses, I watch it; in the gym on the tube and standing in the halls grand buildings. I've seen it everywhere; I seek it always. The image is of a young man strong, slender and smooth as marble, Apollo. I yearn to run my hands over a body of warm stone and know that it is mine.

The body is a sculpture, that much is true. Through time and labour, it can be moulded into something new. What I create is my image alone and the image I seek it isn't one thing, the ideal is fluid. Desire is not a solid thing and shouldn't be. Desire at it's best is intangible and through its intangibility nurture the need for its object. When sculpted to form, the object, the image of Apollo, is found to be fragile and temporary. The ideal is what is strong, the want. The want to be and the need to hold.

I have dreamt of Apollo, the ever-youthful God. The hunter who drives the burning sun. In lust and in envy. Immortal through myth and representation. And when I see those who walk in his image, I yearn to be or be with him, it does not matter which it is. In truth, what I want most is to be seen as him, reflected as his image.
