The wonderful medieval estate of Monfalletto in Italy's famous Piedmont wine region, where rows of vineyards rise and fall over the gently rolling hills, is the birthplace of the expressive and characterful Cordero di Montezemolo wines. At the very heart of the Langhe, in the centre of the Barolo region, a cedar tree has stood on Monfalletto hill overlooking these vines for over 160 years. The Monfalletto estate is made up of 28 hectares of continuous vineyards along La Morra growing Nebbiolo, Dolcetto, Barbera and Arneis, with the exception of the Enrico vineyard VI situated at Castiglione Falletto. The estate became a commercial winery in the 1940s under the guidance of Paolo Cordero di Montezemolo, who propelled the research of winemaking and tasting, producing top Barolos and Barberas. His commercial strategies enabled a global market for the Monfalletto - Cordero di Montezemolo brand. Today, Alberto & Elena, Paolo's grandchildren, run the now modern winery, brilliantly balancing tradition with innovative processes - such as the implantations of Nebbiolo mutations, its ageing in tanks made of stainless steel, the malolactic fermentation in oak barrels, followed by combining the small and large barrels to facilitate distinctive ageing. Aside from the estates ancient fully restored farmhouse, at the foot of the Cedar tree you will find a comfortable and welcoming place for your visit to this beautiful area. 3 independent "Agrisuites" with double bed, bathroom, kitchen and living area, complete with Wi-Fi and air conditioning are available. It's the ideal place to spend a relaxing weekend and enjoy one of the winery tours on offer. The estate has received an acclaimed Certification of Merit of Unesco World Heritage Status for providing a wonderful example of integrated architecture where antique structures blend harmoniously with innovative restoration works.
