Mobile Apps

Here are some tips to help you make the most of your smart device and apps and how to use them with confidence.

Install apps from recognised app stores

It is possible for some apps to exploit your mobile device once installed. This possibility increases if you install an app from a less reputable (or unknown) source. For example, someone could take a popular paid-for app, add their own illegitimate elements and then offer it for free on 'bulletin boards' or 'peer-to-peer' networks. Once the rogue app has been installed to your phone, the hacker could potentially take control of the handset, make calls, incur charges via premium SMS without your permission, or send and intercept SMS and voicemail messages. You may not be aware anything is wrong until it's too late.

So, avoid apps from unauthorised sources, such as 'bulletin boards' or 'peer-to-peer' networks. Instead download your apps from official stores. Above all, exercise caution - research the app and check reviews before downloading it.

Consider content ratings

Apps in some popular app stores provide content ratings. The ratings may help you judge whether an app is appropriate for children.

Typically, the ratings will give guidance on the content and intensity of themes such as violence, offensive language, sexual content, or drug references. You should be aware that each app store has its own content rating policy. This means that ratings will differ from app store to app store.

Please note these ratings relate to the content in the app itself. If you use apps that allow you or your child to connect to the internet and access content outside the app, you may want to consider further device-level or network-level protections, filters or safe search options. Be aware of what permissions you are granting

When you downlad an app, it will often ask whether it can access certain systems or data on your device. This is known as a 'permission request' or a 'permission'. For example, navigation apps may ask for permission to use your "current location" in order to provide accurate directions and location information. Photo editing apps may ask to gain access to your photos so that you can edit photos you take on your handset through the app.

In order to protect your personal information, carefully read permission requests upon download when prompted and ensure you are comfortable with the information you are authorising the app to use.



TLA First - Parent-child Book Club

For our first book, we selected The Ice Monster by David Walliams. Students borrowed the books from the library and then read them with or alongside their parents. They then attended an evening Book Club session in the school's library from 5-6pm where we discussed the book in a really relaxed environment. Bikeability Interest Request

Your child has the opportunity to take part in Bikeability training.

Bikeability is the Government's national cycle training programme based on the National Standard for Cycle Training. Cycling is a life skill with many benefits: it encourages independent mobility, is great for the environment, and improves physical and mental health. Bikeability builds the skills and confidence of people who can already ride and prepares them for a lifetime of cycling. Evidence shows Bikeability helps more people cycle, more safely, more often.

Bikeability is funded by the Department for Transport and Transport for London, and is delivered by trained, professional and DBS-checked Bikeability instructors.

Bikeability trains riders to make independent decisions and practice safe and responsible cycling.

Bikeability is offered at three levels:

Level 1 develops mastery in cycle handling skills in a traffic-free environment

Level 2 develops skills for cycling on single-lane roads with simple junctions and moderate traffic

Level 3 develops skills for cycling on busy, complex roads and junctions.

Riders must demonstrate all National Standard assessment criteria independently before they progress to the next Bikeability level. All participants receive an official Bikeability certificate including a personal cycle skills profile.

FURTHER INFORMATION FOR PARENTS. This course is designed to give the children the chance to participate in Level 3. Participants ideally should be regular cyclists and preferably have attained a Level 2 prior to commencing the course. Each child will be assessed in a playground or similar off road location, before the training commences. The initial section of the course is a refresher of Level 2 outcomes before continuing with the Level 3 training. This section of the course may incorporate complex junctions and road features such as roundabouts and traffic lights and is designed to build confidence in these situations and cope with cycling in traffic with the minimum risk. It will only give your child a basic level of cycling competence on which they will need to build and should not be regarded as a guarantee of their safety

Each child will be continually assessed and will all receive a booklet, badge and certificate.

Bikeability places are limited and places will be booked on a first come basis. Please complete the form below, the school will let you know the date in due course.



Reading at TLA - Parent / Child Bookclubs


