

## Year 10 Students Visit to Colchester United's Jobserve Community Stadium



On Friday fourteen Year 10 students interested in a career within the Sports Sector were given the opportunity to visit Colchester United's, Jobserve Community Stadium to find out more about the opportunities available within this area.

The students were taken on a tour of the stadium and as we went to each area we learned about the different jobs that are needed to support that area. We started by seeing the changing rooms and learned that for a team of twelve players, there are twelve people in different roles who support them to ensure that they are ready to play in a match.



As part of the tour the students were able to go pitch side and sit in the stands. They learned about the staff needed to ensure the pitch is ready and keep the stands maintained. Then the visited the shop, the ticket sales area and the media department.

As well as being used for Colchester United's home matches the students also learned that the stadium is used for events, concerts, conferences and other activities that involve the community of Colchester and the different employment opportunities these activities provide.

To finish the tour the students went to the Chairman's box that overlooks the pitch to learn about the other locations the club have for training in Colchester and again the employment opportunities at these locations.

The students learnt a lot about careers and opportunities within the Sports Sector and thoroughly enjoyed their visit to Colchester United's Jobserve Community Stadium.


### Head Lice

## The PEGI System

PEGI (Pan European Game Information) is the age rating system for videogames in Europe.

The system was created in 2003 by ISFE (Interactive Software Federation of Europe) and the day-to day management is handled by PEGI S.A.

Two administrators handle the rating process: NICAM in the Netherlands (for the games rated 3 and 7) and the Video Standards Council in the UK (for the games rated 12, 16 and 18). The rating process is based on a detailed assessment form of 35 questions about the content of the game. Once the publisher has filled in this form, the administrator will examine the game content in order to determine the final rating.

14,3% rated 7

22% rated 12

12,5% rated 16

6,2% rated 18

The age labels provide a reliable indication of the suitability of the game content in terms of protection of minors. The age rating does not take into account the level of difficulty or skills required to play a game. Content at each age can include:

3: Violence in a childlike cartoon setting.

7: Unrealistic violence towards fantasy characters, sounds & images might be scary for young children.

12: Realistic violence towards fantasy characters, unrealistic violence towards humans or animals, mild swearing.

16: Realistic violence towards humans or animals, sexual nudity, glamorisation of crime, alcohol and tobacco.

18: Motiveless killing of human characters, discrimination, gross violence, sexual activity, drugs.



The descriptors shown on the back of the packaging indicate the main reasons why a game has received a particular age rating. There are eight descriptors: violence, bad language, fear, drugs, sex, discrimination, gambling and online gameplay with other people.
