Second, ABIM may elect to recover an award of statutory damages as set forth in Section 504(c) of the Copyright Act, including for willful copyright infringement of up to \$150,000 for each copyrighted work that defendant unlawfully copied and disseminated. Third, ABIM will also seek to recover its costs and attorney's fees pursuant to Section 505 of the Copyright Act.
