21st Century Tools

Remind, a free communication system, allows for safe text messaging between teachers, students, and parents, and can foster positive relationships.

Google Forms lets you create and edit fillable forms. This is great for teachers making quizzes and tests, and especially useful for principals to manage administrative tasks.

One Strategy I Will Implement Immediately

I'm excited to learn more about how "countif" formulas in Google Forms and Spreadsheets can help me pull together live data in the moment rather than waiting to compile it after the fact. Wait too long to compile data and it's too late to do anything meaningful with it.
