It is tended by farmer Robyn Waxman and her team of volunteer farmers who grow fruits, vegetables, herbs, plants to make dyes, and who care for their friendly farm animals. FARM 2.6 is different than other farms because their seeds, trees and tools come from community donations and half of what they grow is given back to low income or homeless community members. FARM 2.6 is a non-profit organization that hopes to reclaim space to build community, provide food for hungry people, and heal the land. It's amazing what they can do with 2.6 acres!

The Farm on Putah Creek

The Farm on Putah Creek is located on 40 acres of farm land in the Putah Creek watershed between Davis and Winters. The farm on Putah Creek is run by The Center for Land Based Learning, a non-profit organization that educates children and adults about nature and agriculture. Their farm includes a very large walnuts orchard and many different types of fruits and vegetable crops. They also grow native plants on the farm which provides great habitat for wild animals. Some the wild animals that share the farm include owls, river otters, toads, bats, and bluebirds.

Their farm is organic, which means they don't use chemicals for controlling weeds, bugs, and diseases in their crops. They sell their produce at the Davis Farmer's Market and through their CSA (Community Supported Agriculture).

In 1976 the Barsotti family started Capay Organic as a 20-acre homestead located in Capay Valley and by the 1980s, the family was packing produce in their kitchen to distribute throughout the area. Today, Capay Organic, also known as Farm Fresh To You, has grown to 300 acres and distributes CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) boxes throughout California. On the farm, they grow a variety of fruits, vegetables, and nuts, which are sold through many local Farmers Markets and in their CSA boxes.
