REGISTRATION FEES & DEADLINES

Registration forms and fees should be brought with you to check-in on Friday night.

Fees:

\$10.00 per Scout or Leader (Friday, Saturday and Sunday)

\$5.00 per Cub Scout, Scout or Leader (Saturday only)

Registration fees are transferable within the unit, but not refundable.

Cook-Off

There will be a lumberjack themed cook off competition. Each troop will prepare one lumberjack themed meal with a mystery ingredient provided at check in.

Uniforms

Scouts and Scouters should be in Class A uniforms during Saturday evening Flags, Campfire, and Sunday Flags/Scouts Own Service. Class B is appropriate at all other times.

Water & Sanitation

Potable water is available onsite from a hydrant.

Porta-potties and wash stations will be available on site. Please help keep these facilities and the area around them clean. Ruritan Hall facilities are off limits.

Please come with your water jugs already filled. Thank you!

Campfires

Campfires will be allowed as long as we are not experiencing extremely dry weather conditions. Firewood will be provided by troop 124.

Please practice "Leave No Trace"!! Please refrain from burning/scorching the grass.

Check-in Procedures

Check in Times

Friday, April 12, 2019, from 5:00 pm – 8:30 pm

Arrival Instructions:

- Entrances and exits will be clearly marked.
- On arrival, proceed to the check-in station located as soon as you turn off Mauzy Athlone Road. Check-in will be clearly marked.
- Scoutmaster, or designated leader, should bring the following to the check-in station.
 - o Registration Form and Unit Roster
 - These forms can be found at the end of this packet
 - Please make sure that scouts are listed in patrol groupings and have a patrol name
 - o Payment
 - Payment in full due at this time.

For overnighters

- After check-in, your Troop will be directed to your campsite area.
- In order to help make unloading smooth, please follow these guidelines:
 - o Minimize vehicles that are carrying gear. All gear should be in your trailer or the vehicle hauling your trailer.
 - o Back the trailer into your campsite area and unhook. The trailer may stay in the campsite, but NO VEHICLES will be permitted. In the event of wet weather, trailers and/or vehicles may not be permitted in the campsite.
 - o Vehicles carrying gear should off load to the vehicle towing the trailer. Extra vehicles will be required to stay in the parking area.
 - o Vehicles carrying Scouts only should unload quickly and proceed to the overnight vehicle parking area.
- Checking out early? Please let us know!

Check-out Procedures

Your Senior Patrol Leader should report to headquarters when your Troop is packed up and ready to leave. Someone from Troop 124 will come to the campsite to inspect your campsite. Once your area has been checked, you will be free to leave.

If you have to leave early, please let us know at check-in. You should follow the same checkout procedure so that we can inspect the campsite prior to your departure.

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) Training Course

The IOLS course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Position-Specific Training and provides Scouters with the confidence to take youth into the outdoors. Specifically, this hands-on program gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a Scout-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead Scouts in the out-of-doors. In addition, the teaching methods, activities, and games model the variety of teaching used in effective and engaging Scouting programs.

Why: IOLS is required training for all Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters. It is recommended for other adults who will be helping teach youth outdoor skills and interacting with the patrols.

When: All day Saturday, April 13, as part of the Massanutten District Spring Camporee. Checkin at the camporee on Friday night to either camp with your troop or individually.

Important Note: If you are attending with your troop at the camporee, your troop will need adequate adult leadership separate from those participating in the training.

Where: Tenth Legion Mt Valley Ruritan, 1037 Mauzy Athlone Rd, Broadway, VA.

Cost: Camporee registration is required. The course will have no additional fees.

What to Bring:

- Scouts BSA Handbook
- Personal camping gear (find the checklist in the handbook)
- In particular, the following items will be used as part of the training:
 - pocketknife
 - compass
 - matches and fire starters
 - backpack

Meals: You may choose to eat meals with your troop attending the camporee or to bring your own simple camp meals.
