Course Details:

The course focusses on the roles and responsibilities of Shippers & Shippers Agents, including the following:

- Limitations
- General Requirements
- Classification
- List of Dangerous Goods Identifications
- General Packing Requirements
- Packing Instructions
- Marking and Labelling
- Shippers Declaration for Dangerous Goods and any other relevant documentation
- Provisions for Aircraft Passengers and Crew
- Safety Requirements
- Competency Assessment
- Evaluation / Feedback Forms

Course outline and schedule:

The training will take place over 2 full days and will incorporate tea and lunch breaks. Learners will be required to complete a competency assessment on the final day of the course. The pass rate for the assessment is 80% and above.

A certificate of competency and a competency card will be issued to learners within 1 month upon successful completion of the course.

Learners achieving 79% or below will be required to attend a refresher course at an additional charge after which a new competency assessment will be required to be completed.

- Certification: validity of 2 years (24 months)
- The course is accredited through the South African Civil Aviation Authority Minimum of 10 learners required per course
- Maximum of 15 learners can be accommodated per course
