What will we focus on?

KNOWLEDGE: The basics of non-formal education and where to find resources.

SKILLS: How to design an activity fit for your group, how to facilitate an activity, public speaking.

ATTITUDE: What is leadership and how does it functions in youth work, how to gain confidence and keep an open mind.

EXCHANGE: Sharing our ideas, experiences and concerns, meeting people with similar interests.

PRACTICAL TASKS: Possibility to get involved in the preparation of upcoming NSU activities.

PROFILE AND NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS

The profile is youth workers/leaders (volunteers or recently established professionals) in age 20-29. For the TC to reach its full potential, we especially invite participants interested in functioning as team members at future activities such as the youth exchanges "Back to the Roots" in Greenland, "LoopLife" in Finland, or other upcoming NSU activities.

We have reserved 2 places for each Nordic country and area, and 1 place for each Baltic country. NSU members has prioritised right to the places.

WORKING LANGUAGE

The main working language is English. Nordic languages can be used when working in smaller groups if all group members can communicate in Swedish, Danish or Norwegian.

ACCOMMODATION

Hostel standard accommodation in shared rooms.

APPLICATION

Please use the enclosed application form and return it latest on Monday 18th of February 2019 to Pia at NSU (info@nsunet.org).

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

The participants should arrive to central Copenhagen in the afternoon/evening on Wednesday the 20th of March, and should depart after 6 PM on the 24th of March or in the morning the 25th of March.

TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT

Participants or their organisations should book the own travel. The travel reimbursement is 50% of actual costs up to maximum:

- EUR 150,00 for participants from Denmark and Sydslesvig (= max EUR 75,00/ person is paid out)
- EUR 250,00 for participants from Sweden, Norway, Finland, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania (= max EUR 125,00/ person is paid out)
- EUR 350,00 for participants from Iceland and Faroe Islands (= max EUR 175,00/ person is paid out)
- EUR 1200,00 for participants from Greenland (= max EUR 600,00 is paid out)

Due to the strict funding conditions, please follow these requirements to receive reimbursement:

- Most economical way of travel must be used (economy class flights, 2nd class train etc.)
- Documentary evidence must be provided for all travel costs: ticket showing travel route and price paid and the date of payment. If the ticket lacks information about amount or date of payment, add bank or credit card statement. Bank statement is obligatory for payments over 1000 €.
- Travel reimbursement is made by bank transfer to the national organisations offices or participants (depending on agreement) within a month after travel documents for all participants are received by Pia

PARTICIPATION FEE

The participation fee is EUR 50, and will reimbursed from the travel reimbursement. The participant fee can be invoiced if the participant or sending organisation prefer to pay it separately, or the travel reimbursements is less than EUR 50.

The accommodation, meals and programme are covered by the project grant and participant fees.

INSURANCE

The organisers do not offer any travel insurance for the participants. Participants are advised to have travel insurance that covers health, and preferably luggage also. Additionally, all participants are urged to bring a European Health Card (E111) as travel insurance may not cover costs that should have been covered by an E111. The European Health Card can be ordered for free from your national health care web page/ office.
