PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the 32nd year of Anchor Academy. We give thanks to God for His continual grace and provision for our school. As a Christian school, we are committed to providing education through a Biblical lens. We are thankful for the continuing support of our families, for the hard work of our current staff and teachers, and for the new teachers who are joining us for this year.

At Anchor Academy, we strive to continually improve student learning experiences and to provide more learning options. For K-5 we have added a new component for Science known as Mystery Science. This online resource makes learning Science fun through combining Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) skills. For Grades 5-9, we are developing robotic learning camps for students to have a hands-on experience with robots. More online course options will be available for Grades 8-12 as well as revised Grade 10 courses that meet the new Learning Standards.

In Special Education, we continue to provide excellent programs to meet the needs of students who learn differently. With online tutoring, one-on-one support and innovative technology such as MILO the robot and Integrated Learning Systems (iLs) where brain functions are corrected, students are able to improve and meet specific goals in their learning. Centres are being established in various areas to provide hands-on support in a learning environment for students who need more structure.

A major emphasis of Anchor Academy is the promotion of a "Mission" mindset with short-term Mission trips. Students are able to earn high school credits through these Mission courses. Prizes for Scripture Memorization and other contests can be applied towards the cost of the Mission trips.

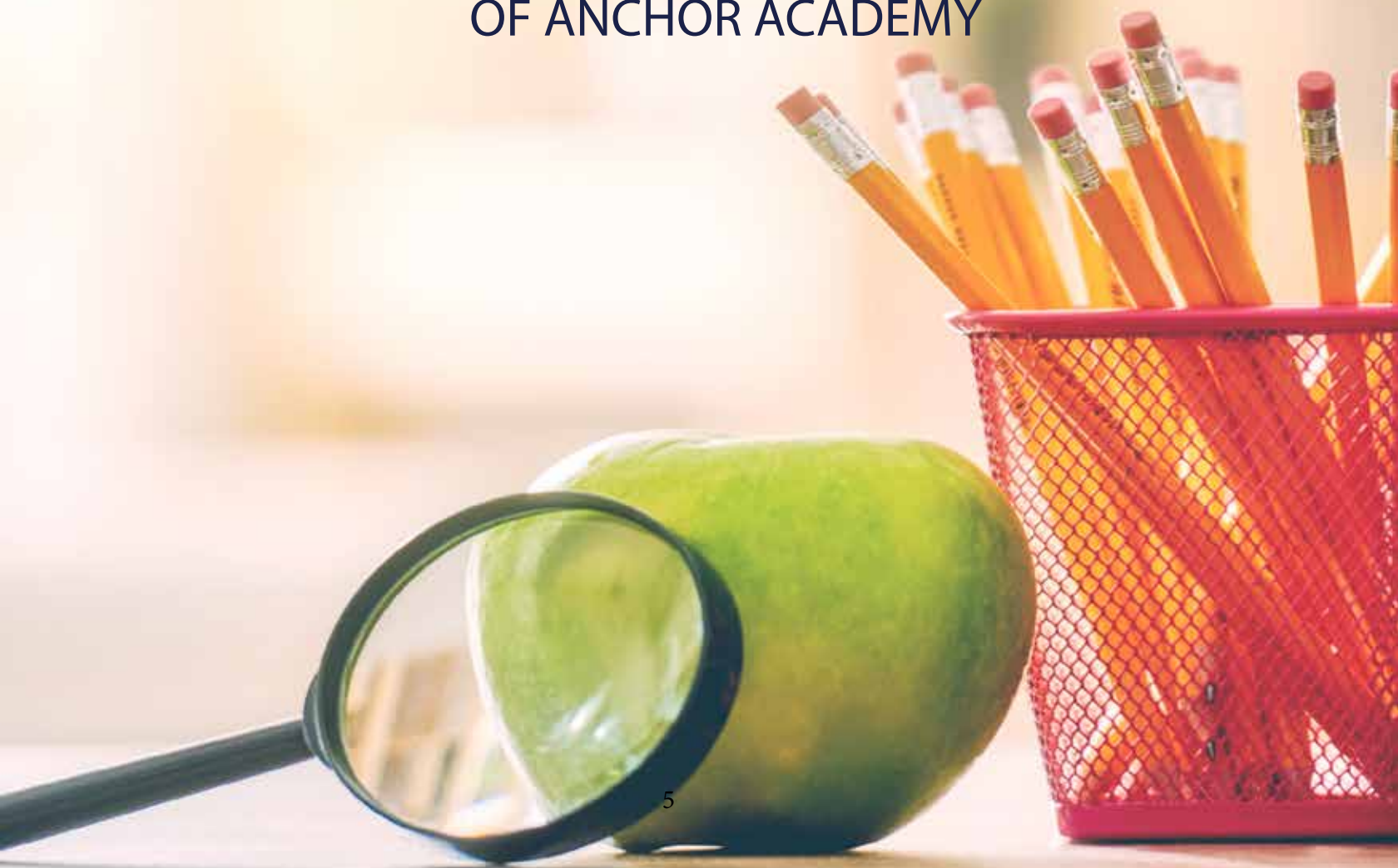
Two incredible benefits of graduating from Anchor Academy are the Grad Celebration, and the generous bursaries awarded for Christian Post-Secondary education.

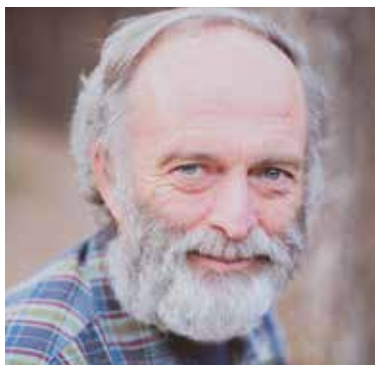

Individualized

In consultation with *Anchor Academy* teacher(s), parents select preferred resources. And with the teacher create a unique Student Learning Plan while meeting Ministry of Education Learning Standards.

Special Education

Gifted teachers and specialists support those students with specific learning challenges. The team works with *Anchor Academy* teachers to implement learning adaptations and modifications.

Adult Graduation

For those students aged 18 and older that want to achieve high school graduation.

Option 2: International Program

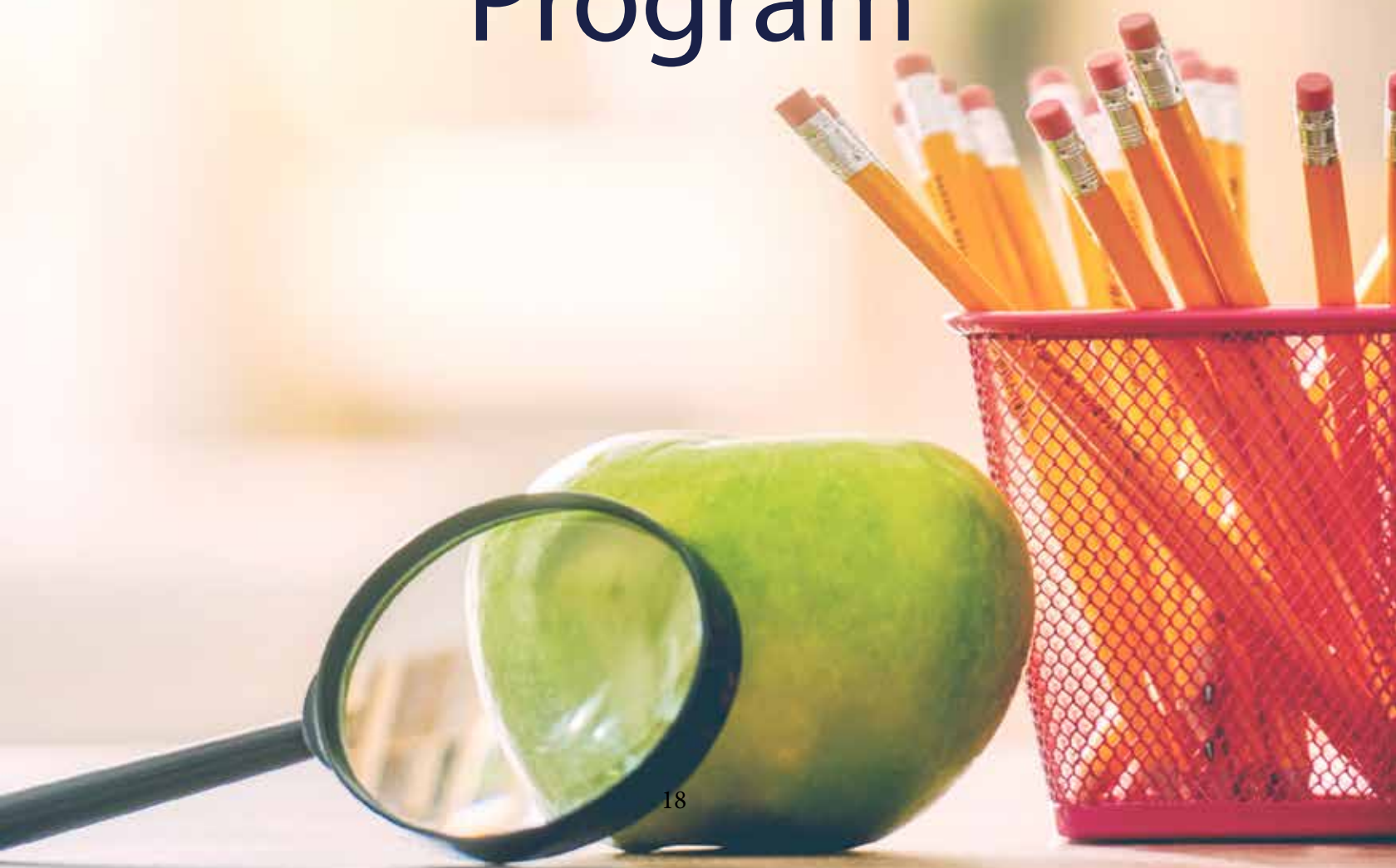

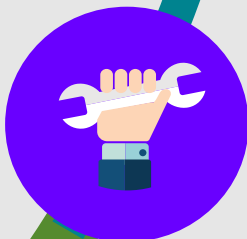

New Graduation Assessment Requirements

As part of the updated graduation requirements, students in the 2018 Graduation Program are required to complete two provincial assessments (Numeracy and Literacy). Students will have two opportunities to re-write these assessments during their graduation years should they wish to increase their proficiency. Their best outcome will be recorded on their final transcript.

Numeracy Assessment

Students who will be meeting graduation requirements after June 30, 2018 and have not written a Math 10 provincial exam will be required to write this assessment in order to graduate.

Literacy Assessment

This assessment is still under development and will be introduced in the 2019/2020 school year. The English 12 and Communications 12 provincial exams will continue until then.

Student Transcript Services

This service allows students to view their final marks and exam marks and to forward their transcripts to Post Secondary Institutions. To access this service, go to www.studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca. Note that all students must first register for a BC Government account (BCeID).

The International Program

This program is open to all families residing provincially, nationally, and globally! The International Program follows learning outcomes similar to the American school system with no B.C. provincial examinations to write. For families residing in British Columbia, the \$150 per student homeschool grant is available and can be applied to International Program school fees and/or curriculum purchases. Families living outside of British Columbia should contact their Provincial education authority for available funding.

FREEDOM & FLEXIBILITY

Freedom to choose curriculum and library resources apart from the standard Accelerated Christian Education (ACE) curriculum currently used in this program, and flexibility in time with no limits as to how long a child works through his/her grade work. An Academic Projection (one of four graduation path options) will be prepared when your child reaches 14 years of age. This document specifies every course required for graduating with an International diploma/transcript.

ACADEMIC ASSISTANCE

PRESCHOOL CURRICULUM

FOURS FOR JESUS

Welcome to “FoursForJesus!” This program is designed to help children, age 4, to prepare for Kindergarten while they grow in their knowledge of the Bible and their relationship with Jesus Christ. You will find below a brief description of the academic aspects of the program. As much as possible, the stories are found in the Bible. The songs are those which we would hear in Sunday school and at Bible camp. Wherever possible, the songs and stories relate to a concept that is in the lesson. Bible verses or phrases are also used to develop the lesson. The cost is \$200 per year. (Please contact the teacher, Mr. Martin Fromme (1.866.380.3577), before registering to ensure that the level of parental involvement is understood.)

SUBJECTS

Math: The children experience the numbers from zero to twenty. Although some children may be able to count beyond twenty, the primary purpose of the number content of the lesson is to get a “sense” of the numbers (e.g. “2”, double, twice, twins). In the section of shapes, students will learn that shapes have special names.

English: Through the stories, following instructions, and expressing their thoughts and observations, the student develops skills necessary for success in English Language Arts.

Social Studies: Children learn about what God has done and what people have done through investigation (photographs) of landforms, development of technology, and culture.

Science: Things that God has made or what man has made are explored by the student. Parents are encouraged to expand on these groupings with books, DVDs, and internet research.

Physical Education: The specific hands-on activities will help develop small motor skills. Balance and large motor skills are developed through the suggested activity.

Art: Colours and shapes are the back bone for the art component of this program. The use of various mediums of expression is also incorporated.

PRESCHOOL WITH ACE & CHRISTI READING PROGRAM

This kindergarten program, based on phonics, features a complete scope and sequence of concepts (four volume daily instructional manuals, song CD, animal display cards, and number train cards) and skills needed to prepare K3 - K5 children to be ready to read. Sixty Accelerated Christian Education (ACE) PACEs (2000 pages) filled with animal pictures, activities, and full-colour picture stories encourage a child to want to read. They will also learn social skills, the wonders of God’s world, and the reality of God’s love. Another feature for the parent or instructor is the easy-to-use format for guiding children from pre-testing through a kindergarten graduation program.

Parents may choose to purchase a brand new kit (phone office for up to date price) or borrow the kit from *Anchor Academy* for \$150 (\$50 refundable deposit upon return of complete kit.). Kit rentals include the same non-consumable resource items as in the new kits. PACEs, however, are not included with the borrowed kits and will need to be ordered separately, \$3.80 + GST each (prices subject to change).

Cost to borrow kit is **\$110 (\$50 refundable deposit upon returning complete kit)**. (If you wish to purchase a new kit to keep, please call the office for up-to-date cost information.) ~ Then order separately; 12 Word Building PACEs (1001-1012) and 3 Math PACEs (1001-1003), to be used in conjunction with the kit. You may also choose the 12 Bible Reading and 12 Animal Science elective PACEs to be used in conjunction with the stories in the kit. Once the 12 Word Building and 3 Math PACEs have been completed, it is time to order the rest of the grade 1 curriculum: Math PACEs (1004 – 1012), and 12 English, 12 Science, & 12 Social Studies PACEs (1001 – 1012).

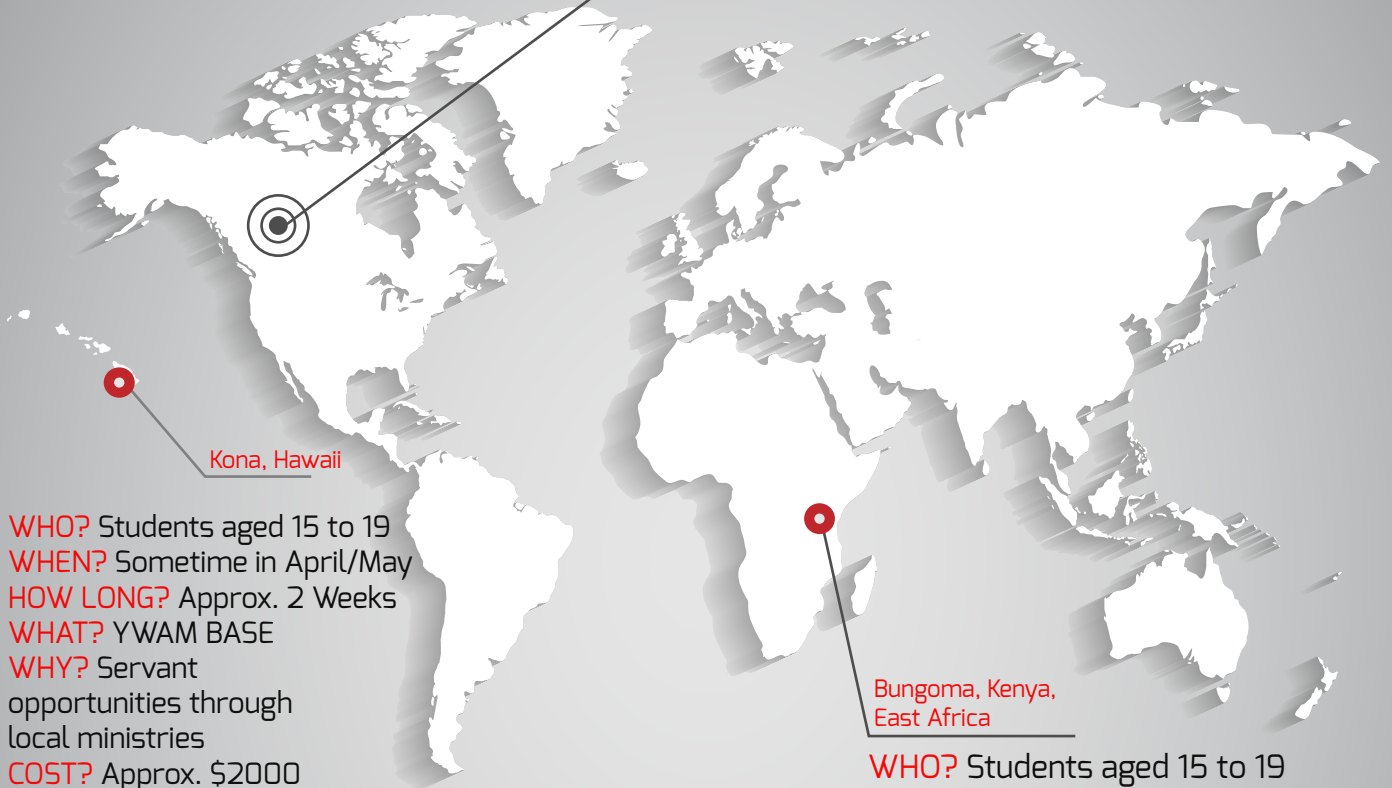
