#### **INSTRUCTION TO STEWARDS**

The Appointed Stewards shall attend the reception, classification and placing of all exhibits, wait upon the judges and afford them the information necessary for the discharge of their duties, countersign the judge's awards and ensure that the prize cards are properly affixed to the prize exhibits and that all classes are judged to prevent any interference during the judging and not allow any exhibitor to be with the judges.

The Society will take all responsible care for exhibits received for exhibition but accepts no responsibility in connection with the exhibits. Every exhibitor who delivers any article, or animal to the Society representatives for exhibition, does so in accordance with these rules.

#### STEWARDS IN EACH SECTION SHALL:

- 1. Attend at the time and place notified
- 2. Receive, classify and place in position all exhibits
- 3. In no way attempt to influence the Judge's decision
- 4. Countersign the Judge's awards, obtain the prize cards from the Secretary and affix same to the prize exhibits.
- 5. Remove all exhibitors and other persons from the vicinity of the Judge's whilst judging
- 6. Not reveal the name of any exhibitor or repeat Judges remarks
- 7. Arrange amongst themselves for constant supervision of their sections
- \* Pavilion Stewards are requested to attend at the close of the show to deliver exhibits to exhibitors or authorised receivers. Stewards are particularly requested to make themselves acquainted with their duties as above, the General Regulations and those concerning the Judges and also to attend early.

#### **RULES FOR EXHIBITORS**

- 1. All entries are to be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and are to be on the ground by the time specified according to the relevant section as per described in the schedule. Displays and stalls which are not considered entries in the different sections are to be on the show grounds by 8.30am.
- 2. All entries to be in writing, class and section to be plainly stated.
- 3. The judges may withhold any prize where they consider the exhibits are not up to show form.
- 4. Decisions of the judges to be final.
- 5. No exhibitor shall be allowed to remove their entry from the ground before 4.00pm on the day of the show.
- 6. Stewards shall be appointed by the Committee to accompany the judges in each section.
- 7. Protests against the awards must be lodged with the Stewards of Sections not later than 6.00pm on the day, accompanied by \$1 to be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous.
- 8. No person other than officials and press representatives to be allowed in the ring with the judge during the competition.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to call upon any competitors or exhibitor to make a statutory declaration as to the correctness and bona fides of their exhibits.
- 10. The committee has the right to make any other rules or regulations that they may deem necessary.

The Society shall not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through, or by any exhibitor or exhibit. It shall be a condition that such exhibitor shall hold the Society harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident. Whilst exercising all care in receiving and dispatching exhibits, the Society shall not, under any circumstances, be responsible for any loss or incorrect delivery of livestock or any other exhibits of any kind, or for any injury done thereto.

#### FROM THE PRESIDENT

Whilst 2019 has been a dry year, and many have experienced difficult times, the Carcoar showground has received a magnificent facelift. This is largely due to the support from the Member for Calare -Andrew Gee and the General Manager of Blayney Shire Council – Rebecca Ryan through the Federal Government Communities Funding Program. We were lucky enough to receive a grant to remove old trees, erect the new picket fence around the oval, plant new trees around the grounds and along the eastern boundary, and build a fence to protect them. The purpose of the grant was to use local contractors and suppliers to encourage spending in the local economy. This was all done within budget before the deadline, and the fantastic results of all the hard work done by contractors and volunteers are evident for everyone to see.

To the volunteers who have helped in any way I thank you. You are the backbone of the Carcoar PA & H Society. Once again, people from near and far have come out of the woodwork to lend a hand. 2019 has been possibly one of the biggest development years for the showgrounds, and without voluntary assistance we simply could not have completed so many projects in such a tight timeframe.

In early August we received the sad news that Ben Lowe had passed away. Ben started helping in the sheep section at the show when he was just 14, and after WW11 he became the Sheep Steward. He was President for 7 years, an active contributor to the show as a Life Member from 1988 and Patron to the Committee since the year 2000. The new cattle pavilion was named after Ben in 2014. Sadly, we have lost a valuable mentor and historian.

Considering the size of our grounds, we have a lot to offer. I strongly encourage everyone to enter something in the show. Whether you are a novice or highly skilled, it doesn't matter – participation is the fun part. The stewards do their best to tweak their sections to encourage more entries, and this year is no exception. An example of this is the feature cake and a sauerkraut section (have a look in the home products section). To all the sponsors who support the show and donate all the prizes, I thank you. We have over \$16,000 in prizemoney to be won on the day, and we simply couldn't continue without the wonderful support we receive. Please support those businesses who support us.

We sincerely hope that you enjoy the day at the "Best Little Show in the Country", and that you will come along and bring your family and friends for many years. If you would like to positively contribute, join the committee at 7:30pm on the 2nd Tuesday of the month from March to November at the Royal Hotel in Carcoar.

#### **COMPETITION RULES:**

NOTE: PIC (Property Identification Code) Numbers
As from 1/9/2012, people with horses on their property
need to apply for a Property Identification Code – this
is a biosecurity measure. PICs are assigned to individual
properties and allocated by the LLS who maintain the
register. You may already have a PIC if you pay your rates
to LLS. Every Exhibitor bringing horses to the show will
be required to list each horse being shown, together with
their PIC for the property from which it has come on the
Waiver Form before competing. ASC Horse Committee.

- All classes will stop at 12 noon for Opening of the Show
- Competitors should be standing ringside awaiting their classes.
- Events will only be delayed at the discretion of the appropriate judge.
- · Lunch break will be taken at the judge's discretion.
- · Any horse or rider deemed dangerous will be asked to leave the ring.
- Drugging of horses will not be tolerated.
- Drug testing may be carried out at this Show.
- Any competitor found to have breached the ASC Disputes and Disciplinary regulations will be investigated by the ASC Disciplinary Committee
- Led Stallions and colts must be exhibited with a bit in their mouths and handled by a responsible person 17 years and over.
- · Unruly animals may be asked to leave the ring.
- A horse at this show is either a Show Hack or a Show Hunter one is not eligible for the other.
- In all breed classes, horses must be registered with the appropriate breed societies and papers MUST be provided if requested, including current proof of membership
- There must be two entries before a Champion ribbon will be awarded or at the judge's discretion
- Every rider is encouraged to wear a safety helmet compliant with the current Australian Standard. Riders under 18 years must wear such a helmet.

#### FILO, SPINACH AND DILL TART

This simple and easy tart can take all kinds of variations. You could swap silverbeet or kale for the spinach, and add a little cooked chicken or smoked salmon to the ricotta mixture.

**SERVES:** 6 – 8

#### **INGREDIENTS**

1/4 cup (60ml) olive oil 1 red onion, finely diced 8 handfuls English spinach (about 1 big bunch), roughly chopped, stalks discarded A few pinches of salt

1 cup (230g) ricotta cheese 1/2 cup (65g) crumbled feta cheese

4 eggs

Grated zest of 1 lemon 1 handful dill, finely chopped 100 g (3 1/2 oz) butter, melted 6 sheets filo pastry 2/3 cup (100g) pine nuts, toasted 1/4 cup (40g) sesame seeds

#### **METHOD**

- 1. Preheat the oven to 220°C (425°F). Heat the olive oil in a frying pan over medium heat and cook the onion for 5 minutes or until soft. Add the spinach, a handful at a time, waiting for it to wilt a little before adding more. Add a few pinches of salt as you go and cook until all of the spinach has just wilted. Remove from the heat and set
- 2. Put the ricotta in a large bowl and whisk in the feta, eggs, lemon zest and dill. Season to taste.
- 3. Grease a 24 cm (91/2 inch) spring-form cake tin with a little of the melted butter. Lay the pastry out on a work surface. Brush one pastry sheet with the melted butter and gently lay it across the tin, then press into the tin so the excess pastry is hanging over the side. Repeat with the remaining pastry sheets.

4. Spoon the spinach mixture into the pastry, top with the ricotta mixture and sprinkle with the pine nuts. Bring the pastry edges over the

top to make a rough lid. Brush with a little more butter and sprinkle with the sesame seeds. Bake for 35 minutes or until the pastry top is golden brown.





#### **QUICK TOMATO CHUTNEY**

Chop 1 kg (2 lb 4 oz) tomatoes and 4 red onions. Seed and chop 2 bird's eye chillies (or to taste). Combine the tomato, onion and chilli in a large saucepan over medium heat. Stir in 11/4 cups (280 g) firmly packed soft brown sugar, 1 Tbsp sea salt and 2/3 cup (170 ml) apple cider vinegar.

Bring to the boil and cook, stirring often (so you don't burn the base of the pan), for 40 minutes or until the chutney is thick and glossy. Divide among sterilised jars and seal. Makes about 4 cups



#### **JAM PASTRIES**

Few home-made treats are more appreciated than a batch of warm pastries filled with jam or vanilla custard. They do, I concede, require terrifying amounts of butter, but... needs must! Fill them with jam as I've done here, or with custard, a layer of frangipane and some thin slices of poached pear or apple. Or try apple and custard, sprinkled with some slivered almonds. Fresh berries are also delicious.

The pastries are best on the day they're made, but can be reheated the next day. If you're freezing them, pop them in the oven straight from the freezer to reheat.

**MAKES:** 12

#### **INGREDIENTS**

1 Tbsp (15g) dried yeast 150 ml (5 fl oz) lukewarm water

A pinch of salt

2 Tbsp caster sugar, plus extra for sprinkling

350 g (2 1/3 cups) plain flour, plus extra for dusting 320 g (11 1/4 oz) chilled unsalted butter, cut into thin strips 1/2 cup (165g) jam (quince is particularly good) Egg wash

1 egg

2 Tbsp single (pure) cream

1. Mix the yeast with the water. Add the salt, sugar and egg and, using your hand shaped like a claw, bring everything together into a lovely shaggy mess. Add the flour and turn the mixture out onto a lightly floured surface. Knead until smooth and elastic, about 5 minutes. Place the dough in a lightly oiled bowl, cover with plastic wrap and leave it to rest in the fridge for 30 minutes.

- 2. Roll out the dough on a lightly floured surface into a large rectangle, about 40 x 30 cm (16 x 12 inches). Arrange all of the butter in the centre. (I know it looks like a lot, and it is, but it's worth it.) Fold the dough edges over the butter to meet in the middle, as if you're making a dough envelope.
- 3. Turn the dough over so the seam is sitting underneath, then gently roll into a 40 x 30 cm (16 x 12 inch) rectangle again. Fold a third of the dough into the centre, then fold the other third over the top so that you have three layers of dough. Wrap in plastic and pop back in the fridge for 20 minutes. Take out, reroll and return to the fridge for another 20 minutes. Repeat the rolling and chilling once more.
- 4. Line a large baking tray with baking paper. Gently roll out the pastry into a 48 x 36 cm (19 x 41/4 inch) rectangle and cut this into 12 cm (41/2 inch) squares. Place a dollop of jam in the centre of one pastry square, fold the edges over to make a little parcel and place on the tray. Repeat with the remaining pastry squares. Let the pastries rest in a warm place for 20 minutes. Meanwhile, preheat the oven to 220°C (425°F).
- 5. Whisk the egg and cream together to make an egg wash. Brush over the pastries, sprinkle with a little extra sugar and bake for 15 minutes or until golden brown.




