BE THE CHANGE

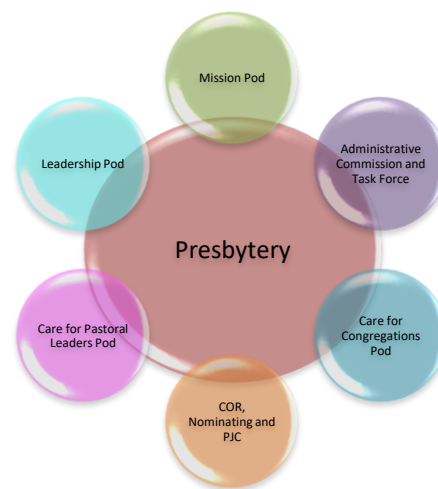

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

-1 Peter 2:9-10 NRSV

As Protestants, 2017 is the year in which we observe and celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. We have just passed the date when Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses on the door of the Wittenburg church. That marked a turning point in the Church as someone dared to challenge the idea that salvation came through the priesthood, a very Old Testament way of looking at things. In Jesus' time, sacrifices at the Temple were made through the priests. Although Jesus preached otherwise, and seemed to indicate through his choice of disciples that anyone was welcome, old habits die hard. The early church was loosely organized, but as it grew, it fell into old habits of hierarchy, which mutated through the years into the Church in which Luther served.

Northern Plains Presbytery is currently undergoing a change that seems only slightly less monumental to us than did the Protestant Reformation to 16th Century Europe. We no longer have the old committee structure that was largely dictated by the Book of Order; we now have "Pods." These Pods



have divided up the functions deemed necessary to the functioning of the Presbytery, and people who have a passion for those functions are invited to specialize in doing them. Those people with a passion for ministry outside the necessary functions have been invited to continue those ministries with like-minded folk in the Mission Pod. All the members of the Presbytery are invited to take part in the work of the Presbytery "...in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of

him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light."

Change is not easy. Those of us who have been in this Presbytery forever would really like to "Make Northern Plains Great Again." We long for Generous George to bring another Support Spot to the floor of presbytery; we long for a closing resolution from Bills, Overtures and Resolutions thanking the host church; we miss the many past Moderators who have gone to "that great cloud of witnesses." We have changed a lot through the years, and none of it has been easy,

but most of it has been necessary. As fallible humans, we have a tendency to see cause and effect erroneously. Our changing demographics caused the changes to be needed; the changes did not cause the changing demographics.

Change is not easy, but it is inevitable. Change is not for some and not for others. Change is for everyone in this Presbytery. Be a part of the change and find the place where you belong in the new structure and join in proclaiming God's mighty acts to the world.

FALL PRESBYTERY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The 117th Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of the Northern Plains was hosted by the First Presbyterian Church of Hallock, Minnesota, on Friday and Saturday, October 6-7, 2017. The meeting covered bylaw and policy changes;

formation of a commission and a task force; commissioners to the 2018 General Assembly; and actions on candidates, overtures, and property.

Revised bylaws and policies were presented to support the new Presbytery structure which was approved at the 2016 fall meeting. Major changes in the bylaws gave all temporary members full voting privileges, changed the parameters for determining how many commissioners each church may send to a presbytery meeting, and replaced committee language with Pod descriptions. Policies are being reviewed by the Pods. Those policies not already revised and approved will continue to guide the presbytery during their review.

Sadly, it was announced that the First Presbyterian Church of Minot, North Dakota, is closing. A five-person closing commission was elected to oversee the orderly closing of the church: Teaching Elders Darrel Cory and Donna Monteith and Ruling Elders Stan Hurst

(First - Minot), Marilynn Ogden (Mendenhall – East Grand Forks), and Sylvia Pringle (United - Jamestown). A seven-member task force will be formed to explore and consider alternate Presbytery staffing models. The task force will present recommendations at a special presbytery meeting in February 2018.

The meeting of the 223rd General Assembly will be held on June 16-23, 2018, in St. Louis, Missouri. The Presbytery elected its commissioners: Teaching Elder Mary Holtey (First - Fargo), Ruling Elder Marilyn Dean (First - LaMoure), and Young Adult Advisory Delegate Sedalia Mahlum (First - Bismarck).

First Presbyterian Church of Moorhead, Minnesota, has issued a call to candidate Robert T. Drake, who is under care of the Presbytery of Northern Waters. Robert was examined by the commissioners and found ready to be ordained. Ruling Elder Jane Holtzclaw was moved from Inquirer to Candidate status under care of the Presbytery.

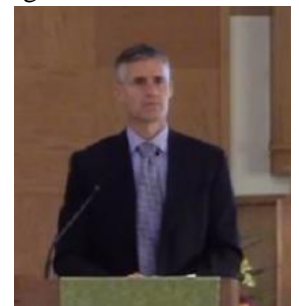
Two overture issues were presented. It was voted to concur with an overture from the Presbytery of Central Nebraska concerning the Administrative Personnel Association. An overture from the Presbyterians for Earth Care on directing the Board of Pensions and the

Presbyterian Foundation to divest from fossil fuel and to invest in renewable energy was defeated by a close vote.

Two property actions were approved: sale of the church lot at Willow City and permission for the Midway Parish to rent their manse.

NOTICE TO CLERKS/MODERATORS OF SESSION

With the elimination of the Session Records Committee, changes have been made to the Session Records review procedure:

- (1) At least one clerk/moderator of session trained (attended two or more record reviews) shall set up a record review annually;
- (2) with other clerk(s)/ moderator(s) of session, within their region, to read each other's record books. (Example: Clerks from Bismarck/Mandan/Steele/Wilton/Glencoe can contact one another and set up a reading at one of those churches);
- (3) Trained clerks/moderators can stamp or sign off on the last page by writing the examiner's name, date, place and number of exceptions;
- (4) Examination lists should either be scanned and sent or copied and mailed to the Records Task Leader, currently Lana Schultz, PO Box 891, Casselton, ND 58012;
- (5) Churches will no longer receive a letter from Presbytery with scheduled record reviews. Each clerk/moderator is responsible to have the church's records read annually.

Under the new pod system, the Records Task Leader will serve as a resource person to:

- (6) provide contact information, if needed, for clerks/moderators setting up record reviews in their regions and
- (7) maintain and present an annual report to Presbytery naming complying and non-complying congregations.

In response to inquiries about electronic recordkeeping, Session records are to be reviewed annually [G-3.0108a] and maintained, preferably on acid-free paper, in written/typed hard copy book form in a fireproof, waterproof safe at the church. This form of recordkeeping ensures that records will always be readily available for review. With the constant changes in software, electronic records, over time, are not always readily available or software compatible, resulting in earlier records being lost. For this reason, electronic records will not be accepted for record reviews. Please retain a hard copy of session records, minutes and register.
