

Resolution of the North Carolina Board of Electrolysis Examiners to Surrender the Board to the Authority of the State of North Carolina

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Board of Electrolysis Examiners desire to cooperate and collaborate with the State of North Carolina as it seeks to consolidate licensing boards to simplify and save resources for the state; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Board of Electrolysis Examiners is the smallest state board. It recognizes that membership of professionals has reduced from over 200 to less than 100, thus, attrition of capable and willing professionals to serve is not sustainable; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Board of Electrolysis Examiners has been fraught with conflict resulting in resources lost by both the State of North Carolina and Board, extended periods of time with a partial board, lack of essential cohesiveness, as well as, rendering it less effective in function and enforcement; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Board of Electrolysis Examiners endeavors to preserve its professional state licensure, protect the public and promote profession in a positive manner.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the North Carolina Board of Electrolysis Examiners authorizes the Board Chair to submit Resolution of Surrender to the Authority of the State of North Carolina, cover letter with recommendations, and additional pertinent information.

A motion was made by **Cheryl Delaney, LE** and seconded by **Girish Munavalli, MD** for the above resolution, and up being to a vote was duly adopted on this the 31st day of January, 2016.
