

Sleepover FAQ's

Where will our group be sleeping?

You will be sleeping in our exhibit galleries, which includes Contact Cove (stingrays and sharks), Ocean Tunnel (sharks and tropical fish), Sea Cave (flashlight fish and eels), or the Submarine (jellies and giant spider crabs). Depending on the size of your group, you may be spread out throughout these exhibit areas, but all three include amazing animals to view. Sleeping spots will be chosen on a first-registered-first-pick basis.

Will we be fed during the sleepover?

Yes! You will receive a dinner of pizza (cheese and pepperoni), salad, fries and drinks. The next morning, a continental breakfast will be served, including muffins, pastries, juice and coffee.

Can I bring an air mattress to sleep on?

We ask that you leave blow-up air mattresses at home due to limited space in the exhibit areas, however we highly recommend that you bring a foam sleeping pad to make your night more comfortable.

How can I make my night more comfortable?

We recommend bringing a warm sleeping bag and pajamas, as it can get cool overnight. If you are a light sleeper, you might consider bringing ear plugs and/or an eye mask.

Will I get to see everything at the Aquarium?

Over the course of the sleepover program you will get to see the all of the exhibits.

What type of activities will we be doing at the sleepover?

All groups get to explore the Aquarium without the daytime crowds, take part in an age-appropriate activity, enjoy campfire with s'mores and a night sky viewing. Check out the Sleepover Schedule of Events and What to Bring for more details.

Are there showers available in the morning?

The Aquarium does not have showers; however there are bathrooms for changing, brushing teeth, etc.

Is there a spot for smoking during the sleepover?

No. There is no smoking or tobacco use permitted on Aquarium grounds. There are no smoke breaks allowed. Please plan accordingly with patches, etc.

Will the Building be Secured?

For your safety and that of the aquarium, the building will be secured from entry until first team member arrives in the morning, including alarming. It is important for you to know that all participants need to remain inside the building from entry point until departure the next morning as any attempt to access the outside, except in the case of emergency, will trigger a response.
