David Birdsell has centered his academic work on the nexus of communication, media, and information technology in politics, government and nonprofit administration. He studies public access to information technology and advises nonprofit and governmental institutions on their communication and technology programs.

His recent work on developing public sector leaders has led to the creation of more than 20 leadership programs offered in partnership with government and nonprofit organizations in New York. An expert on political debating and widely published on communication theory and practice, David is a regular guest commentator on debates and other aspects of political communication for local, national, and international television and print media.

**Jonathan Engel***Associate Dean and Professor, School of Public Affairs*

Jonathan Engel conducts research in the historical evolution of U.S. health and social welfare policy and has published several books on the topic. He is currently writing a history of the U.S. health system since 1970.

Dr. Engel started at the School of Public Affairs in 2008. Previously he was a professor of healthcare policy and management at Seton Hall University for 13 years, and taught courses in health care finance and policy at the Mailman School of Public Health at Columbia University and at the School of Public Health at the University of Massachusetts.

Richard D. Parsons is a senior advisor at Providence Equity Partners Inc., a leading private equity investment firm specializing in media, communications and information companies. He is also board chair of Citigroup, Inc. From 2002-2008 he was chairman of the board and CEO of Time Warner, Inc., the world's largest media and entertainment company. *Institutional Investor* named him the top CEO in the entertainment industry in its 2005 report on America's Best CEOs.

Before joining Time Warner in 1995, Mr. Parsons was chairman and CEO of Dime Bancorp, Inc., one of the largest thrift institutions in the country. Prior to that, he was the managing partner of the law firm Patterson, Belknap, Webb & Tyler. He has also held various positions in state and federal government, as counsel for Nelson Rockefeller and as a senior White House aide under President Gerald Ford. Mr. Parsons earned his bachelor's degree at the University of Hawaii and his law degree at Union University's Albany Law School.

In 2008, Mr. Parsons served as a member of then President-Elect Barack Obama's economic transition team. His other civic and non-profit commitments include chairman emeritus of the Partnership for New York City; chairman of the Apollo Theatre Foundation and the Jazz Foundation of America. He is a board member of the Museum of Modern Art and the American Museum of Natural History. Mr. Parsons is also a member of the boards of The Estee Lauder Companies, Inc. and Madison Square Garden, Inc.

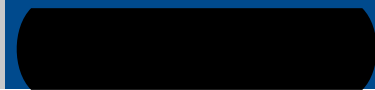

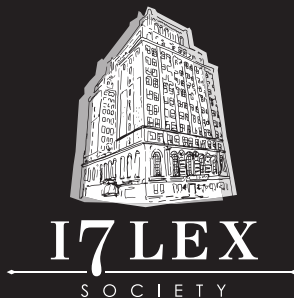

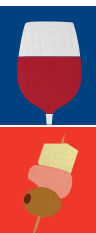
