**SUMMARY:** Grant County 243 Fire 50% contained. Showers at times 50's. Air quality remains good. Possible regional thunderstorms Friday. 75 anniversary of D-Day. June 6<sup>th</sup>, 1889 marks 130 years since Great Seattle Fire.

### WA STATE FIRE MOBILIZATION:

#### HWY 243 FIRE – Grant County, WA

Fire is currently 50% contained burning nearly 19,000 acres of grass and sage brush. Forecast calls for increased winds as high as **30 mph** between 6 pm to 9 pm. Friday possible isolated thunderstorms. Next week temps in 90's.

**WEATHER:** Partly cloudy this morning. Increasing clouds with periods of showers this afternoon. High near 60F. Winds SSW at 5 to 10 mph. Chance of rain 40%.



**Friday regional Thunderstorms possible.** See lightning, go inside! Event period appears to be from Noon to 6 pm.



**THIS DAY IN HISTORY: D-DAY 75** - On June 6, 1944, also known as D-Day, Allied Forces landed on five beaches along a 50-mile stretch of the heavily fortified coast of France's Normandy region. Codenamed Operation Overlord was one of the largest amphibious military assaults in history.

### REMEMBERING 1889 SEATTLE FIRE:

June 6<sup>th</sup>, 1889 a massive fire destroyed most of Seattle. 130 years later the city continues to build. In 1889 the population was about 25 thousand. Today an estimated population of 7.66 million people call Seattle home.
