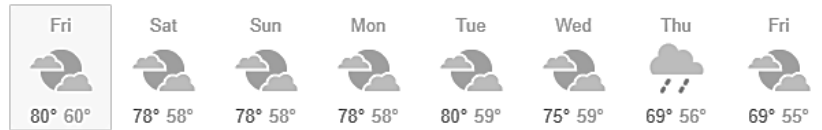

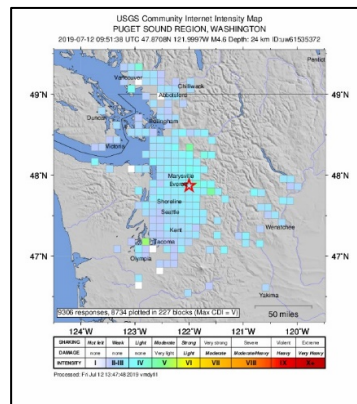
4.6M QUAKE | 80'S DRY | FIRE RISK HIGH

WESTERN WASHINGTON				
AIR QUALITY	FIRE WEATHER	RIVER FLOODING	WIND GUSTS	EXCESSIVE HEAT

SUMMARY: A 4.6 magnitude quake occurred near Monroe, WA. No reports of damage. Tropical Storm Barry strengthening, expected to make landfall as Category 1 storm. Local temps rise to 80 degrees in some areas.

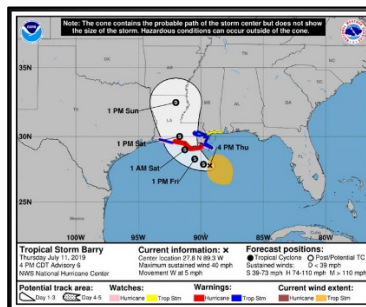


WEATHER: Friday partly sunny, high near 76. Overnight partly cloudy, with a low around 59. North northwest wind 9 to 13 mph becoming east northeast in the evening.



4.6M EARTHQUAKE:

Monroe, WA – This event occurred over 13 miles deep and was followed by a 3.5 aftershock. This event was felt widely from as far south as Olympia, WA to the Canadian border to the north. No damages reported at the time of this report. Be prepared!
