SUMMARY: **Flash Flood WATCH / Warning for Central Chelan County in north central Washington.** Flash flooding occurred in Everett, WA from heavy storm cells releasing over 2 inch of rain in less than an hour. Oregon coastal 4.0 magnitude earthquake. Lightning starts island wildfire fire.

WEATHER: Showers, cloudy, high near 69. Wednesday partly sunny, with a high near 71. Showers continue today brief drying period Wednesday and Thursday.

3 SIMPLE STEPS FOR FLASH FLOOD SAFETY

During a flood, water levels and the rate at which the water is flowing can quickly change. Remain aware and monitor local radio and television.

- 1 GET TO HIGHER GROUND**
Get out of the areas subject to Flooding
- 2 DO NOT DRIVE INTO WATER**
Do NOT drive or walk into flooded areas. It only takes 6" of water to knock you off your feet.
- 3 STAY INFORMED**
Monitor local radar, television, weather radio, internet or social media for updates.

EVERETT FLOODING: Two torrential downpours in Snohomish County released more than two inches of rain in a short period of time. Most of the rain fell between 12:15 pm and 1:30 pm. The Everett High School is closed due to flooding.

LIGHTING SPARKS WILDFIRE: ORCAS ISLAND, WA – Saturday's lightning storm sparked a small wildfire near Eagle Lake on Orcas Island early Sunday morning. A 10 foot-by-10-foot area of fire burned multiple trees, brush and root beds just after midnight Sunday.

OREGON EARTHQUAKE: A magnitude 4.0 earthquake occurred off the coast 264 from Yachats, Oregon. This event was not related to the Cascadia Subduction Zone. No tsumai threat from this event.
