Asbestos Management Plan

Southeastern Local School District has completed the Building Re-inspection and Management Plan Update for our buildings in our District and will continue Surveillance Inspections each six months as required by the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986 (AHERA).

AHERA Regulations require all buildings be re-inspected for asbestos containing building materials and a Management Plan Update developed for the management of asbestos containing materials by a certified consulting firm. This has been completed by Carl Frazier, Certified Asbestos Hazard Evaluation Specialists, Springfield, OH 45501.

Non-friable asbestos has been discovered on the bottom of stainless steel sinks, floor tile, and friable thermal (pipe, tank and boiler) insulation. These areas pose no health hazard except when damaged. Much of the asbestos containing materials have been removed since the initial removal in 1989.

The over all condition of the asbestos containing materials is good and management procedures are now in effect to control the asbestos exposure.

School personnel are trained in safe methods in dealing with damaged asbestos containing materials (ACM) in emergencies. We will, however, be removing the ACM based on the hazard assessment and as funds become available.

It is significant to report to you that the buildings in your district have been well maintained in regard to the immediate asbestos problem, and we will continue to maintain the ACM in as safe a condition as possible until removal.

The Re-inspection Report and Management Plan Update for each building is located in the Building Office. You are welcome to inspect and read the report as you desire, but it cannot be removed from the office. You may have copies made for a small charge. Welcome to the Superintendent's Message:

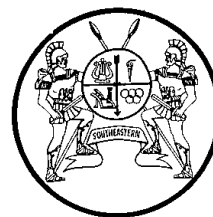
The 2016-17 school year is quickly approaching. I sincerely hope all of our students, staff, parents and community have experienced a wonderful summer. This summer has witnessed more positive changes within the district. Miami View Elementary now has a new fence across the back of the playground to aid in providing a safer area for students. The stage floor at MV was also sanded and refinished. New aluminum bleachers were purchased for the MV stage area and a new kiln is being installed in the MV art room.

Significant changes have also happened at the Jr/Sr High School. Many of the doors throughout the building are being replaced with sturdier and safer doors. Waiver of School Fees

The Southeastern Local School District shall waive fees assessed by the District only for students whose parent(s) or guardian are unable to afford them. The Superintendent may, as deemed necessary, establish additional procedures to supplement the procedures established in this policy regarding the requests for the waiver of fees.

Eligibility Standards

Students eligible for a waiver of school fees include, but are not limited to, the following:

- A. Students who qualify for free lunches or breakfasts under the School Free Lunch Program Act.
- B. Students whose families have suffered very significant losses of income due to severe illness or injury in the family or unusual expenses including, but not limited to, fire, flood, or storm damage.
- C. Other good and just reasons.

Parents should request a waiver form from their Building Principal. **DRUG TESTING FEES ARE NOT SUBJECT TO BEING WAIVED.**
