



PSYV – Response to Incidents – Scenario 1

You attend the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo to aid the elderly and less able up Castlehill. You are working with another Youth Volunteer and you have your radio. Your Group Coordinator and Adult Volunteers are helping at the top and bottom of the hill. Whilst helping an elderly lady with her bag, she trips and falls causing her to bang her head. You see that she is bleeding. Her husband starts to panic.

What would you do?



PSYV – Response to Incidents – Scenario 2

You are working at a local event with another Youth Volunteer. You are working in the car park helping to direct traffic. You observe a car come into the car park and on attempting to park you see it collide with another parked car. The driver does not appear to have noticed you and moves the car into another space. The driver checks the damage on both their own car and the one which was hit before walking away.

What would you do?



PSYV – Response to Incidents – Scenario 3

You are working at a local gala day. There are approximately 2000 people present. You are working with another Youth Volunteer to hand out crime prevention leaflets. You observe two females arguing with each other. Both have pushchairs with small children. The argument quickly escalates into a physical fight and they do not appear to be stopping. The children are crying and other members of the public are just walking by or standing to watch. One person is filming the fight on their mobile phone.

What would you do?



PSYV – Response to Incidents – Scenario 4

You are assisting with a national housebreaking campaign and are delivering leaflets door to door in the evening. It's dark and you are alone however there is another Youth Volunteer over the street and your Adult Volunteer is two doors along and can see you as well as the other Youth Volunteers. Whilst putting one leaflet through a door you overhear very loud shouting and banging from within. You hear a male voice shouting followed by a female screaming and smashing glass.

What would you do?

PSYV – Response to Incidents – Scenario 5

You are working at a large-scale event during which there is a parade through the street. You are tasked with standing along the edge of the road to ensure small children do not run out into the parade. There are another 9 Youth Volunteers working at the event. You are all spread out along the road. Your Group Coordinator and Adult Volunteer are walking up and down checking to ensure each of you are okay. Your GC and AV are now further down the road when you hear what sounds like gun shots from the back of the crowd. The crowd panic and begin to run in several directions.

What would you do?



PSYV – Response to Incidents – Scenario 6

You are working at an event in a park selling programmes at the entrance with another Youth Volunteer. The entrance is near to a main road. Whilst here you hear the sound of screeching tyres and look up to see a car crash into a motorbike causing the rider to come off and slide a considerable distance along the road. Several members of the public are clearly shocked. The driver of the car appears to have passed out and the motorcyclist is not moving.

What would you do?



PSYV – Response to Incidents – Scenario 7

You are at the Scottish Police College at Tulliallan attending the Annual Competition. Whilst walking from one activity to another you observe a male with a dog sitting at a bench within the college grounds. You are aware that the college is a public right of way and as such members of the public can freely walk around the grounds. You notice this male leaves a rather large rucksack by the side of the bench and walks away. The bench is near to the Castle entrance.

What would you do?



PSYV – Response to Incidents – Scenario 8

Whilst volunteering at an event in the city centre, your Group Coordinator advises you all that a three-year-old boy has been reported missing and was last seen not far from where you are. You are provided his description. Whilst with another Youth Volunteer you observe a small boy who appears to match the age and description of the missing child. You observe he is with two older teen girls who in your opinion look a bit suspicious. You try to tell the Group Coordinator/Adult Volunteer over your radio but another Youth Volunteer is taking a long time to pass a message and therefore you cannot inform them of what you have observed. The child and two older teens have now walked round a corner out of sight.

What would you do?
