Last month Kevin Deighton made a comment in the Missionary Article regarding smart phones, noting that you'll need someone under the age of 40 to help you use them. That's quite topical as I recently upgraded my mobile phone. The one I now have is certainly not up there with the most advanced ones but is much better than my previous one at only a little extra cost. It can do a myriad of things – most of which I don't understand! No longer do I need to input text messages – I can just speak to it and it will do it. Internet, now that I have '4G', is so much quicker – so much information available at my fingertips. I could go on.

The most interesting thing I think is how much it appears to know about me! It tells me where my car is parked, how long it will take to get home. It even worked out, without me telling it, that I'm a Notts County supporter and it told me, without me asking, what the latest score was. Amazing! How much more does it 'know'? It's quite a scary thought.

However much it knows, it pales into insignificance with how much God knows about me. I love Psalm 139 – look at this small part of it: 'You have searched me and you know me. You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar you are familiar with all my ways. Before a word is on my tongue you know it completely O Lord. You hem me in – behind and before; you have laid your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain'. David who wrote it went on to describe how it's impossible to be anywhere where God isn't!

It's a scary thought as to what my phone appears to know about me – but it's both a comfort and a challenge to know how much God does know... David finishes the Psalm in this way: 'Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting'. He knows everything, down to the minutest detail, and because He does He can take care of all my needs. **What a comfort that is – and He knows you too!**

If you're wise, you'll surround yourself with people who support you emotionally and spiritually, and you can share your dreams and ideas with them. C.S. Lewis and J.R.R. Tolkien were members of The Inklings, an informal literary discussion group associated with Oxford University. It comprised teachers, writers, and friends who met regularly at a well-known Oxford pub to discuss passages from their favourite books as well as their own writings. In 1936, they decided the world needed more novels that had faith and morality as their central theme. Lewis and Tolkien decided to write science fiction after realising the inferior quality of similar stories being published at the time. They literally tossed a coin to decide who would write a book on space travel versus time travel. Tolkien got the time travel nod, but his early efforts with such a story never really worked out. Later, however, he would achieve great success with *The Lord of the Rings*. Lewis wrote his famous series of novels called *The Space Trilogy*, and from that momentum he eventually penned *The Chronicles of Narnia*.

Now, you may not reach that level of success, but you'll go further with the encouragement of true friends than you will without it. So ask yourself what's involved in cultivating the kinds of friendships that'll help you fulfil your God-given potential. It may mean coming out of your shell and reaching out to others. Could you encounter hurt and rejection? Sure! But you'll succeed only if you're willing to take that chance...

Hi everybody, as promised I will update you on the visit of Novimost on October 11th. Colin/Phil will be co-ordinating both the morning and 2nd Sunday Services. Ali (field director) and Mick Holstead will be coming to visit, together with Marios who works out in Bosnia. I trust it will be a great day of challenge and fellowship with our colleagues from Novimost whom we have supported for many years.

In other news we have made the following gifts in September: £60 to World Vision which will shelter a Syrian refugee family of 4 in Serbia for 3 weeks, £50 to Operation Mobilisation and their ongoing Mercy Appeal, £50 to OMS (One Mission Society) for their work in the Third World, £50 to BAM (the By All Means Gospel Trust) who print Bible translations and Bible reading notes - most notably 'Break and Meditate'. They supply a lot out in the regions in India where our 'Twin Church' is located.

This leads me on to Margaret Odell's request at the last Church Meeting for info on the Samaritans Well Project. I contacted Keith Mersch who promised me a comprehensive update soon. However, I can tell you that they have now provided 120 hand water pumps and the pastors have started scores of micro enterprises meaning families can feed themselves. Also a new scheme is in it's infancy, a sewing circle but with machines! More info to follow as soon as it's in my possession.
