# ...warning signs!



Yesterday people were all talking about one thing – the colour of the sky! It was a very yellowy colour here but in other places it was more orange and almost red. We've now discovered that it was caused by the remnants of Hurricane Ophelia dragging in tropical air and dust from the Sahara Desert as well as debris from forest fires in Portugal and Spain also playing a part. In more than one place I saw it described as 'apocalyptic' and people speaking of the 'end of the world'. If that's what you thought - it was a false alarm!

Then later in the day I saw another orange light – this one was on my dashboard telling me that there was a problem with the pressure of one of the tyres. I had a guick look and everything looked OK so I carried on - only to discover this morning on closer inspection that one of the front tyres had a screw in it. A quick visit to the garage and all was fixed. Definitely not a false alarm!

All around us there are warning signs – and they are there for a reason. They are to warn us of danger, or possibly of something approaching. Jesus spoke about warning signs. His disciples asked him what would be the sign of his coming and the end of the age. You can read how Jesus answered in Matthew chapter 24, but the signs include famines, earthquakes, wars, the rise of false prophets and persecution of believers and more. We can be sure that there will be a day when Jesus will return – he spoke about it! But when will it be? The answer is that only God the Father knows - even Jesus doesn't know when it will be. We do know that it will be at an unexpected hour, like lightening, like a thief who comes in the night. Everyone will know about it.

When we see things like the sky changing colour and hear of the things noted above, it should not alarm us but it should turn our minds to the coming again of the Lord Jesus Christ in power and glory. Jesus said we should be ready and keep watch - are you ready for that event? Have you put yourself right with God and accepted forgiveness through Jesus? Don't leave it too late. If so, are you living a life where Jesus is set apart as Lord? Who knows – the sky may be like it was yesterday, but there is one thing for sure - it won't be a 'false alarm'!

One day a man was getting his windscreen washed at a petrol station. When the attendant finished, the man said, 'That's a terrible job. Re-do my windscreen - it's as dirty as when you started.' So, the attendant wiped it again. The man looked it over and in frustration said, 'That window hasn't changed a bit.' The man's wife was sitting next to him in the car fuming. She reached over, pulled off his glasses, wiped them, and gave them back to him. The attendant had been doing his job correctly. The man himself was the problem all along.

Spiritually speaking, the glasses you're looking through determine what you see, and how you see it. When you look through the lens of jealousy and envy, you become resentful of the blessings of others. When you look through the lens of judgementalism, you speak and act without mercy and grace. When you look through the lens of fear and unbelief, you limit God and forfeit what He can do for you. When you look through the lens of selfishness, you put yourself first and your loved ones suffer. When you look through the lens of negativity and cynicism, people begin to avoid you because you're not enjoyable to be around. 'Be clean, you who bear the vessels of the LORD.'

Just as your glasses need to be wiped clean from the contamination around you, so do your heart and mind. How does this happen? Jesus said, 'Now ye are clean through the word which I have spoken unto you' (John 153 KJV). Through prayer and daily Bible reading, your perspective on life is kept right.

# two minutes silence

In the month, when we think about those who have given their lives in war, the two minutes silence is a familiar act of remembrance. We can use the silence to reflect on those who have suffered in war or on what it means to work for a peaceful world. Or do we end up thinking about lunch or panic that we haven't switched our phone off?

Victor Frankl, a victim of Auschwitz, suggested that the most intolerable of all human conditions is not imprisonment or hunger, but lack of meaning. The two minutes silence enables us to connect with Jesus' message, which offers true meaning to our lives and world. He spoke of giving ourselves in love for each other and the world, 'Love your enemies and pray for those that persecute you' (Matthew 5:44). He also demonstrated such love in sacrificing His own life, 'Greater love has no-one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends' (John 15:13). In observing the silence, let's use it to reflect on this sacrificial love, as we remember all those who have experienced pain and conflict.

Of course, we should be serious about silence and stillness in the whole of our lives, not just for two minutes at an act of Remembrance. In busy lives where so much is clamouring for our attention, silence enables us to reassess our priorities and rediscover true meaning in our lives. Jesus made a habit of withdrawing to experience silence. He did this before choosing his disciples, after He heard of John's beheading, after feeding the 5000, after healing a leper, at the Transfiguration and to prepare for His death. 'The seeking out of solitary places was a regular practice for Jesus. So it should be for US.' Richard Foster.
