



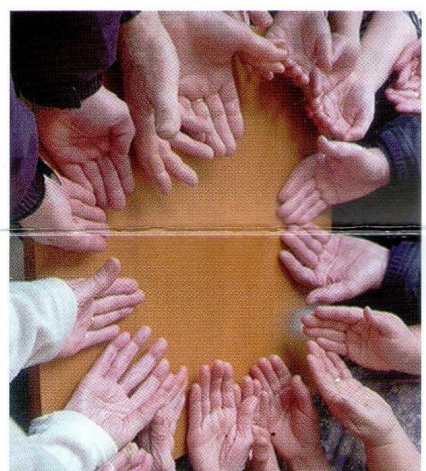
The little café with a big heart

Since 1979 The Cellar Café has served the local community in Godalming, as one of the two branches of the Warehouse Christian Trust.

The café is open to everyone and also provides a friendly and safe place where people can meet and discuss problems amongst themselves and with our staff who are trained in listening skills.

Those with mental health issues, learning difficulties and the isolated, disadvantaged, vulnerable or emotionally stressed are welcomed into a non-threatening environment. They can find a sense of belonging to an extended family where joys and sorrows are shared, in an atmosphere of acceptance, openness, hope, fun and friendship.

People of all faiths and none are encouraged to visit The Cellar through close links with local churches, GPs, Citizen's Advice and other local organisations.



Centrally placed in Godalming, The Cellar has opened its arms over the years to many disadvantaged and misunderstood groups in the community. People with drug or alcohol abuse problems, the unemployed and homeless, or those suffering from stress or serious illness have been helped. The Cellar has always provided a listening ear and prayerful support. Every Tuesday morning staff, trustees, and friends meet to review and pray over matters of concern and joy.

Prices in the café are kept to a minimum, and volunteers help to serve and prepare food, and also provide cakes and soup. A free simple meal is available to customers if needed, together with bags of donated food and toiletries, and emergency help can be given with clothing and accommodation. At Christmas festive food and gift parcels are distributed.

Many Cellar customers are isolated or lonely. Through The Cellar they can be helped to integrate into society. A subsidised Summer day trip to the coast and a lunch at Christmas are popular events. The upper room is used for counselling and private talks. The Art Club provides therapeutic and social activities, with inreach workshops at Watts Gallery, and work displayed in the Big Issues exhibition.

To raise funds, ice creams are sold by The Cellar at the popular Godalming Sunday bandstand concerts. Essential income comes from the financial support of Friends' donations and regular fundraising events.
