



Final Project Ideas

As a part of the Tech Goes Home training, we recommend that the trainer require each participant to create a final project. The final project should assist the participants to integrate the various skills and tools they have learned as a part of the training. The process should help the participants to see the value of each tool as a means of communicating information.

The expectations for the final project might include:

- creating several slides using Google Presentation
- uploading pictures/videos
- researching information of interest
- citing sources
- sharing their new learning in a public forum (in person, via hangout, with trainer)

Some suggestions for final projects include:

Plan a weekend with your family where all the events you attend are free. Use Google Presentation to present the itinerary to your fellow participants. Feel free to make the weekend themed based. For example, do an entire weekend of music or art.

Research resources that you would add to the Live, Learn, Earn, Work, and Play categories. Explain why the resource you found is important and how it is relevant to your life.

Find five jobs that interest you using online job sites and create a Google Presentation with one slide about each job. If finding new jobs is of no interest to you, perhaps look for five volunteer opportunities.

Using CommonSenseMedia, research the top five pieces of media that your children consume. This could include books, music, apps, video games, movies, and more. Create a presentation about what you found. Are your children looking at inappropriate material? What are your strategies going to be to address what they see and interact with?

Find an online college course you might want to take. Places to look include www.EdX.org and CollegeBoard.com. Create a presentation describing the course and how it will benefit your life.

Using Google Calendar, create a family calendar that lists all important dates and events including doctors appointments, work schedules, birthdays, school events, etc.
