A MESSAGE FROM OUR NATIONAL DIRECTOR

GIVING AS WORSHIP

The Church of the Nazarene in Canada has had a long history of faithful and sacrificial giving. The call to support God's work at home and abroad has been met with conviction and resolve. It could be argued that the Church of the Nazarene is a microcosm of the ethos of the country we call home. The offering of oneself in ministry stewardship is, according to Romans 12 verse 1 "true and

proper worship" (N.I.V.)

At home and abroad Canadian Nazarenes play a vital role in this true and proper worship. We are committed to supporting God's work where He is already present. In 2018 our congregations raised almost \$15 million for all purposes. When I think of this, I really need to stop and take a bite size look at this reality......that means that on average each church raised nearly \$91,000 in tithes and offerings. Each church, the large ones, the medium size ones, the small ones (which is our largest component) and the PAC's. Think on this for a while... it is truly amazing. These amounts come from people who sit in the pew Sunday after Sunday. They are not usually mega-givers, they are however people who have somehow understood what "true and proper worship" is and as a result, punch well above their weight in the ring of Christian stewardship.

In addition to this, we are heavily engaged in overseas ministry. Sometimes partnering with CFGB (Canada Food Grains Bank) where we are able to realize a 3 to 1 or sometimes a 4 to 1 matching grant from Global Affairs Canada. Nazarene Compassionate Ministries Canada, led by Reverend Elaine Bumstead is engaged in following areas of "true and proper worship" impacting God's children around the world. Blankets and mosquito nets for Rohingya refugees, a school building extension in Zukuma, Malawi or blankets and Food Security Projects in Nepal and Bangladesh, or sponsoring Leadership & Discipleship Projects in creative access areas, or funding 3 Child development Centres in Sri Lanka, or new church buildings, purchase of goats

and sponsoring agriculture conservation projects in Malawi, the support of "Girls Home Ministries" in South east Asia, or Anti Human Trafficking projects in the Philippines and Refugee support for the Middle East.

Our Compassionate Resource Warehouse located on Vancouver Island and directed by Dell Marie Wergeland. Twenty two container shipments were dispatched around the globe, filled to capacity with life changing and often life saving goods... here is where they went... Creative Access Areas of Eastern Europe & the Middle East, The Gambia, Swaziland, Ghana, Haiti, Liberia, Nigeria, Ethiopia, Zimbabwe, Sierra Leone. This just doesn't happen by accident. There were 44,475 volunteer hours, 108 volunteers, people who are invested in the work of the Lord through serving and giving and who understand "true and proper worship". The ministries of NCMC (including Compassionate Resource Warehouse) amount to a stewardship investment of several million dollars.

For well over 20 years the Church of the Nazarene in Canada has supported the work of the Church of the Nazarene in Cuba. It may have been the building of student accommodation at the Seminary in Punta Brava, or the "Pastor Partnership Program" or the myriad of Work and Witness Teams from each Canadian District, or the most recent response to the terrible air disaster in May 2018 where a team from Canada travelled to the island with financial and physical aid.

I have been reading a book written by our former Governor General David Johnson entitled, "The Idea of Canada: Letters to a Nation". In the book he talks about what makes us who we are. He cites one story that peeked my interest. "Many years ago Mother Teresa made her first visit to Canada to share with Canadians the story of her work to help the dying, sick and destitute in Calcutta. An editorial in one of our country's major newspapers lauded her intentions, yet despaired at the futility of her efforts. Her work was described as a drop of hope in an ocean of despair. what was the point, the paper proclaimed, in helping a mere several hundreds of people in a city of millions in a country of hundreds of millions, most of whom lived in desperate poverty. This was very troubling for Governor General Johnson and as he prepared to respond to the article he remembered an experience which he described as an "epiphany". When he was Dean of Law at Western University in London, Ontario, he had a colleague by the name of Andy McFarlane. Andy was the Dean of Journalism at the same university. He was also a "magician" on the side and he would perform at children's' birthday party's on Saturdays. One day Johnson went to see McFarlane at work and was invited to stand in the back to watch the faces of those amazed children. Andy declared that he was going to change water into wine and produced a glass of clear water from his cape. Johnson was watching carefully from behind and as Andy moved his hand and sleeve over the glass he was able to pour a small vial of food colouring into the water and upon moving his arm to reveal the glass again, there it was for all to see, the water had turned red. This was the moment of "truth". It only took one little drop to transform a large glass of water, and it only takes one little drop to transform an entire community, for you see, it's not about math, it's about chemistry.

North of the 49th parallel in the land we call home, we who call ourselves Nazarene understand that giving is "true and proper worship" and we seek to go beyond mathematics into the realm of God's Chemistry which takes what we give and suits it to His purposes.

The "Order of Canada" is awarded to those who have contributed in an extraordinary way to society. It is a medal in the shape of a snowflake. Every snowflake is different and as it joins forces with other snowflakes gains the force is indeed to be reckoned with. There are over 12,000 Nazarene "snowflakes" in Canada who have come together to be greater than the sum of their parts. Joining together in the mission of God calls us to remember that He can do amazing and wonderful things by taking what we joyfully give and multiplying it to suit His purposes. The hymnwriter, Frances Havergal makes a promise in her prose when she presents herself to God... "Take my silver and my gold, not a mite would I withhold, Take my moments and my days, Let them flow in ceaseless praise"...indeed, "true and proper worship".

In 1878, four years after writing this hymn (Take my Life and Let it be), Frances wrote to a friend... "The Lord has shown me another little step, and of course I have taken it with extreme delight. Take my silver and my gold now means shipping off all my ornaments to the Church Missionary House, including a jewel cabinet fit for a countess, where all will be accepted and disposed of for me."

"Now to Him who is able to do infinitely more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us, to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever, Amen." (Ephesians 3 v 20 -21)

Almost three years ago the proposition was made to a gathering of leaders from both Vancouver First Church and Primera Iglesia. "Would you send a Work and Witness Team to central Guatemala? And would you commit yourselves to raise a combined total of \$52,000.00 in order to construct a district training, and housing facility?" The new Nazarene district Verapaz Del Sur was being formed for twenty-three churches in the rural area of Tactic.

We accepted the invitation despite the fact that Guatemala is deep in Nazarene history dating back before the formal establishment of the Church of the Nazarene 1908. So representatives of these two local churches banded together a leadership team and launched

fundraising efforts. The theme of those fundraising efforts was: BUY A BRICK \$40! We employed this theme so everyone could get a handle on it and participate. In March 2018 a team was dispatched to Tactic.

One of the first activities to get the ball rolling was a joint dinner between First Church and Primera with an auction attached. The top item of the auction was a 30 minute sight-seeing flight over Metro Vancouver donated by Captain Glenn Oerzen of Snow Bird fame. Looking back



I remember how those fundraising efforts did at times falter. A client, of team member Mark Kennedy, donated his entire vinyl record collection of 5,700 to help the cause. It took a team of six to catalogue this entire collection. But the visions of this pot of gold soon evaporated and was eventually sold for \$400. However our new associate pastor, Lori Ward



picked up our sagging spirits. She developed a visual display on the wall of the church's foyer. Little red bricks were pasted on the wall as each \$40 donation was received. Those and others pushes from team leaders Eddie Beer and Mark Kennedy helped get us over the goal line.

On Wednesday morning October 30, 2019, these guys with pictures and celebration smiles disembarked from Air Mexico flight AM 694. Mission Accomplished!

November 2nd Toronto Emmanuel Spanish Church hosted the GTA Missional Zone Prayer Gathering. It was a powerful time in the presence of God.




CANADA WEST DISTRICT (C.W.D.)

NAZARENE COMPASSIONATE MINISTRIES CANADA (N.C.M.C.)

NCM Canada sponsors Disaster Response Training

On October 29 and 30, forty Nazarenes from across Canada participated in a Disaster Response training entitled "The Church and Disaster Response"

7 from Canada Atlantic District

15 from Canada Quebec District

16 from Canada Central District

2 from Canada Pacific District

The training was facilitated by Brandon Sipes, the Disaster Response coordinator for NCM International via Zoom (video conferencing medium) and recorded. An additional 14 Nazarenes asked for the link to the recording.

Participants learned about NCM and how NCM responds to disasters globally, how NCM partners with other organizations in disaster response, the protocol for communication during a disaster, how local churches can access resources for disaster response,

etc. They learned about preparing their households and their local churches for a disaster, how to identify the most vulnerable, and how to access survival kits and crisis management information for their municipality. Trainees participated in a case study of a disaster where they had to make decisions of what to do during the first 24 hours, the first week, and beyond the first week.

Perron Goodyear of the Salvation Army Canada, a guest presenter, explained how the Salvation Army responds in time of a disaster.



NCM Canada has an agreement with the Salvation Army Canada whereby trained Nazarene volunteers can become registered as Disaster Response Volunteers with the Salvation Army and work under the direction of the Salvation Army during a significant disaster. The Salvation Army offers additional courses to all of its volunteers in the following topics

- Introduction to the Salvation Army Emergency Services (required)
- Foundations of Emotional and Spiritual Care
- Incident Command System
- Meet & Greet
- Ministry of Presence
- Preparing your congregation for disaster

Highlights from NCM Canada reports

The NCM Canada team met in Mississauga for their annual face-to-face meetings.

John Watton reported on the Anti-Human Trafficking Safe House in the Philippines. Up to 15 children and youth are being cared for at any given time by NCM in partnership with International Justice Mission. He also reported on two dormitory projects with Nazarene house parents in a creative access area. Children from poor rural families can have a room and board while taking higher education in the city. Many of these become church leaders and pastors.

Dell Marie Wergeland reported on containers of Gleaners dried vegetable mix being shipped and distributed in both Malawi and Mozambique following Cyclone Idai. Currently a shipping container is being loaded with desks, hospital beds, maternity packs, and medical equipment destined for a health clinic and a school on the Ivory Coast.

Milon Patwary described how NCM Canada is funding 16 pastors in an Masters of Divinity program in Bangladesh and funding livestock, wells, and church buildings.

Alan Cristales shared how 1000 families displaced by flooding in southern Malawi are receiving food and seed for replanting their crops. This is a project funded through Canadian Foodgrains Bank. The project will be extended for another 4 months up to the next harvest. He also told of the rapid adoption of conservation farming in central Malawi and the formation of "farmer's clubs" in the churches and how this has helped the Church of the Nazarene to spread to neighbouring communities. The new conservation agriculture project planned for 2019-2020 will serve 14 new communities.

Elaine Bumstead reported on her visit to Senegal to meet with leaders from creative access areas of Africa where NCM Canada is funding a leadership and discipleship program in multiple countries. She also shared results of the 3 year CFGB food security project that just finished in Nepal where the income has doubled for project participants and their food sufficiency is now almost four weeks per month. NCM Canada is funding the construction of a church in this same area.

Dennis Hubert shared how he and his church raised \$2000 and responded with food and gift vouchers for neighbours - single mothers and needy families whose food spoiled during the power outages following Hurricane Dorian. These families couldn't afford to replace their food.

Marg Stahlbaum reported that the Canada Central NYI are preparing to fill and ship another container of books for school libraries in Swaziland.

The following needs have been identified -

- Livestock, bicycles and books for Bangladesh pastors
- Church / chapel building at Zukuma Nazarene school (Malawi) partially funded
- Teacher's houses at Zukuma Nazarene School
- Need for repairs to school building in the Middle East. These schools serve refugee children.
- Food assistance for hungry families in Kenya (funded through CFGB)
- Food security project in Nepal for 10 new communities (1000 families) funded through CFGB
- Food security project in Bangladesh funded through CFGB conservation agriculture project in West Africa.
