Greetings in the Name of our Risen Lord!

There are a number of ways to begin a letter or a communication piece, but I love the one I have just used. The short form of this greeting would be "In Jesus Name" but to spell it out is to reference the reality of a spectacular moment in time, but also the ongoing reality that Jesus isn't dead anymore. He was dead, but now He is alive.

Take a moment right now and think about that. This reality puts everything into perspective. The grand result of the resurrection of Jesus is that we too are able to live in the reality of victory over death. I heard someone recently say......Jesus is Risen and we still worry about what kind of music we use in worship. Jesus is Risen and we still critique the content, length or style of the preacher's message. Jesus is Risen and we still get anxious over things of little or no consequence. I am not suggesting a reckless approach to life and ministry but I am appealing to your basic Christian belief that Jesus died for you and that He rose again to secure victory over the greatest enemy a human can face......death! So that's why I greet you today in the Name of our Risen Lord. The Early Church would greet each other with the words... "He Is Risen" and the response..... "He is Risen Indeed". I don't know for sure, but it seems to me that the emphatic "Indeed" serves to affirm and reassure belief in the reality of resurrection.

So, In the Name of our Risen Lord......until the next time!

Shipping Container of food from Canada arrives in Cape Verde

A large shipping container of Gleaner's dried foods arrived recently in Port of Praia, Cape Verde, (Africa) destined for distribution through Nazarene churches in Cape Verde. Prolonged drought has caused severe food shortages. Compassionate Resource Warehouse in Victoria BC. in partnership with NCM Canada shipped the food in November. Blankets Distributed to those suffering in the cold

The winter in Nepal and Bangladesh is unusually cold this year with temperatures dipping to zero or near zero degrees (C). Some days, for people in mud and bamboo houses with no central heat and just light cotton clothing, that is unbearably cold. The very young and the very old suffer the most.

NCM Canada has funded blankets to be distributed through our churches in both Nepal and in Bangladesh. Thank you for giving blankets through the NCM Canada gift catalogue. You are making a difference!

Women in Nepal are happy to have more food for their families

In a recent report from Nepal, we learned that the women in 10 villages in Central Eastern Nepal are happy to have more food to feed their families. They are participants in a 3 year Canadian Foodgrains Bank funded project aimed to increase food security for 1000 of the poorest of families in this area. The women learn how to maximize production of vegetables on their small plots of land. They are learning the value of vegetables in their diet and they are able to sell excess vegetables to buy other needed foods.

Not only are you helping families in Nepal, through CFGB / NCM Canada funded projects you are also helping refugee Rohingya families living in camps in Bangladesh, as well as families suffering from famine in South Sudan and a creative access country in Africa.

PASSING OF REVEREND DR. ROY FULLER

Please pray for the family of James Roy Fuller, 80, resident of Prattville, Alabama, who went home to be with the Lord on Tuesday, January 30, 2018. Dr. Fuller was the first District Superintendent of Quebec, Canada. Roy was born in Union Springs, Alabama. He is a 1955 graduate of Elba High School and of Trevecca Nazarene College (1959). In 1997 he received an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from Trevecca. He was a minister in the Church of the Nazarene for 58 years, serving as pastor in Fort Walton Beach, Florida, Gadsden, Alabama and Panama City, Florida. He served as District Superintendent for 39 years on four districts: Italy, Quebec, Pittsburgh and Alabama South. We as the Church in Canada are indebted to his pioneering spirit.

Dr. Fuller was preceded in death by his wife, Nina Sue (Schofield) Fuller, son, Stephen Paul Fuller; parents, C. E. and Katie Lee Fuller, by a sister, Juanita Lindsey and brothers, Gene Fuller, and Jerry Fuller. He is survived by a son, Dr. J. Phillip Fuller; two daughters-in-law, Cheryl Fuller and Martha Schmoecker; four grandchildren, Jonathan (Laura) Fuller, Mason Schmoecker, Marissa Schmoecker and Malina Schmoecker; one great-granddaughter, Arabella Fuller, one sister, Jo Anne DeVane; extended family and many friends.
