Mitigation Effectiveness Criteria	Evaluation Rating	Score
Will the implemented action result in lives saved?	Assign from 5-10 points based on the likelihood that lives would be saved.	
Will the implemented action result in a reduction of disaster damages?	Assign from 5-10 points based on the relative reduction of disaster damages.

- ▶ **Complete:**
  - ▶ Estimated Cost: Do your best based on your jurisdiction; a range of \$ is fine
  - ▶ Responsible Organization/Department: What position or department will be in charge of implementing the action? Police, Fire, Administration, etc.
  - ▶ Action/Project Priority: From the STAPLEE sheet- write score and H, M, or L
  - ▶ Timeline for Completion: Can be a range of time and up to five years, ongoing
