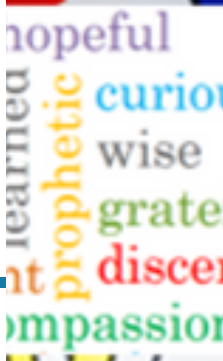
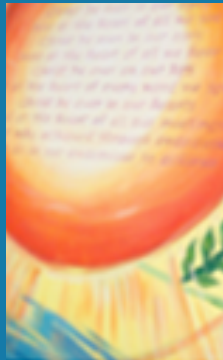
A MESSAGE FROM MISS BURROWS

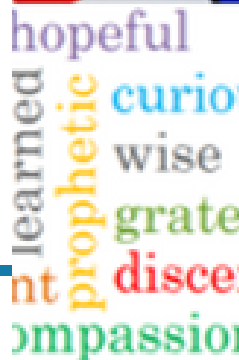
ENRICHMENT NEWS

YEAR 7, 8 AND 9 INFORMATION

Thank you for your attendance at our Academic Tutorial meetings on Thursday 24th October. We hope that they were an opportunity for meaningful discussions about your child's progress. Following conversations with tutors, half term is an ideal opportunity to talk to your child about their progress. Our key messages are:

- Homework is weekly - see what your child has been set through Class Charts
- Students should be reading for at least twenty minutes a day. Reading is a skill and like any skill, can be improved the more you do it!
- Vocabulary - ask your child about Word of the Week!
- Students should aim to join an Enrichment Club at lunchtime/attend after school clubs
- Parents/carers should ensure that they have logged into Parent Mail, Accelerated Reader Home Connect and Class Charts in order to follow your child's progress and receive information about or pay for school trips and visits
- Students should be encouraged to use **dual coding** to summarise their learning that day through pictures
- Please use your child's diary to communicate with your child's tutor
- Remember the **Ilslay Way!** READ - Routine, Engagement, Ask, Dual Coding
