Discussions

Old Business:

- There were no bills slated for discussion as Old Business.

New Business

- S.19-A-016 Concerning the funding for sponsored Campus Recreation Center (CRC) memberships for participants of the University of Cincinnati's Advancement & Transition Services (ATS) program
 - This appropriation bill focuses around the IMPACT Innovation program that falls within the Advancement & Transition Services program (ATS), as well as the memberships for the Campus Recreation Center (CRC)
 - ATS was defined as a program that is dedicated to fostering quality life experiences for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, where, under the direction of specialized faculty, staff, and peer mentors, the programs offer vibrant and inclusive community experiences on the University of Cincinnati's campus.
 - The appropriation bill goes on to explain that the IMPACT Innovation program is still a young program within ATS and was unable to secure specific funding due to its infancy; the bill mentions that a number of participants within IMPACT are from low-to-at-risk income families, and the additional fees of CRC membership will be problematic for the program's retention. In the two years the IMPACT program has been in existence, participants of IMPACT Innovation have logged 4,000 visits to the CRC.

- The appropriation bill states that the University of Cincinnati prides itself on equity and inclusion, and that ATS is an “immensely impactful (program) within Cincinnati and unique among Midwestern universities.
- This appropriation bill focused on obtaining the appropriation of \$7 800.00 with a 10% overrun of \$780.00; a total of \$8 580.00 to be allocated from the FY2019 Student Government Budget to sponsor the Campus Recreation Center memberships for participants of the IMPACT Innovation program for the Fall Semester 2018 through Summer Semester 2019.
- The appropriation bill went into executive session.
- The appropriation bill was tabled indefinitely on September 26th, 2018 by a vote of 27 – 0 – 2.
- S.19-A-017 Concerning Co-Sponsorship of the annual Nearly Naked Mile hosted by Cincinnati during Homecoming week
 - On behalf of External Holdover Senator Chandler Rankin, speaking privileges were given to Gallery member CEAS Senator Emeritus & Nearly Naked Mile Co-Chair Emma Lowe for the duration of the discussion of the bill S.19-A-017.
 - This appropriation bill outlines the Nearly Naked Mile, an event hosted during Homecoming Week by the Cincinnati Honorary Society.
 - The appropriation bill goes on to explain both the Cincinnati Honorary Society and the Nearly Naked Mile, defining them as such:
 - The Cincinnati Honorary Society (Cincinnati) is a co-ed honor society founded in 1917, dedicated to the recruitment and retention of students and alumni at the University of Cincinnati.
 - The Nearly Naked Mile is an annual event that takes place on the Wednesday of Homecoming Week at the University of Cincinnati each year, an event whose purpose is to foster community among students and alumni, bring Bearcat spirit to campus, and be a “staple” of Homecoming Week.
 - The appropriation bill includes further details about the event, including purpose, logistics, and intended use of appropriated money:
 - Cincinnati will be hosting the 12th annual Nearly Naked Mile this year on October 3rd from 8:00pm – 9:30pm on campus with an expected attendance of 500 people (2017 attendance: 400+ people).
 - Branded t-shirts, the intended purchase item of the appropriated money, are to be provided for the runners at the event. The t-shirt will include the Student Government logo should co-sponsorship be approved.
 - The branded t-shirts are considered a quintessential part of the event, as they can contribute to a cohesive atmosphere and boost morale.
 - The appropriation bill also states that all proceeds from the event will go towards the St. Vincent DePaul Foundation.
 - This appropriation bill focused on obtaining the appropriation of \$501.60 to be allocated from the “Co-Sponsorships” line item of the FY2019 Student Government Budget to be used in purchasing t-shirts for runners at the event.
 - The appropriation bill was discussed and was voted on, with a vote of 29 – 0 – 0.
