Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Thank you for your interest and support of our mission. We are **providing high quality healthcare free of charge to those who are most in need of it but are unable to pay.** Thanks to our collective efforts throughout **2017**, we believe that by **June 6th, 2018**, Most Rev Dr Joseph Edra Ukpo, Archbishop *emeritus* of Calabar, our eponym, will officially commission JUHRI Afua Site for outpatient clinical services, by the grace of God. On **Oct 24th, 2010**, in my room in the University of Cambridge, Archbishop Ukpo approved my proposal to build a network of research hospitals in the Catholic Ecclesiastical Province of Calabar but he did not know that the effort will be named in his honor. On **April 29th, 2014**, he did the ground-breaking at our first site, in Afua, Uyo Diocese, after duly obtaining permission from Most Rev Dr John Ayah, Bishop of Uyo. Since then, he has been presenting JUHRI's progress reports to the current proprietors of JUHRI, namely, Most Rev Dr Joseph Ekuwem (Archbishop of Calabar), Most Rev Dr John Ayah (Bishop of Uyo), Most Rev Dr Camilus Umoh (Bishop of Ikot Ekpene), Most Rev Dr Camilus Etokudoh (Bishop of Port Harcourt Diocese) and Most Rev Dr Donatus Akpan (Bishop of Ogoja Diocese).

As in previous years, our success in 2017 ensued from the moral and prayerful support of our proprietors. On **Feb. 9th 2017**, we carried out our 5th Mobile Clinic in Calabar, following the approval of Archbishop Ekuwem. On **Sept. 2nd, 2017**, we held our 6th Mobile Clinic for the first time at our own 1st Site, Afua, following the approval of Bishop John Ayah.

Following these free mobile clinic services, our volunteer clinicians sent me emails with questions and remarks such as: "Father, when are we going again?" "Thank you for giving us the privilege of serving those in need" I never imagined that Specialist Consultants will be so happy to keep providing clinical services, free of charge. They cherish JUHRI's mission and have their own stories of the **joy** they get from sacrificing their time, talents and skills.

It is the same joy I see in the eyes and responses of our donors, through **Friends of JUHRI**. Financially, we received **\$59,039.59** in 2017 alone, including **\$24,100** from my salary. I pray that I get beaten this 2018. Asset-wise, the Sisters of St Francis of the Holy Eucharist take the lead: they donated equipment and supplies worth over \$200,000 and these were off-loaded into JUHRI on 3rd Oct, 2017. We wrapped up the year with the production of our own disinfectants and further construction work. Once again, the outstanding strategic target is to open the Out-Patient Clinic in 2018. Please continue to support us. Thank you very much. God bless you all.

5th Mobile Medical Outreach, St Mary's Efut Abua, Calabar, Cross River State.

February 09, 2017

Following approval by Archbishop J. E. Ekuwem JUHRI volunteer medics (middle) gave free clinical care to 32 priests of Calabar Archdiocese, Cross River State, Nigeria, on 9th Feb 2017. Most of these priests work in rural areas without

access to medical facilities. The priests in turn help organize the rest of the community for our medical outreach programs, as they did during our 1st outreach (Akpabuyo, CRS, 7th Jan 2016), 2nd Outreach (Akamkpa, CRS, 31st March, 2016), 3rd Outreach (Mfamosing, CRS, 16th June 2016) and the 4th Outreach (Ikang, Akpabuyo, CRS, 23rd Nov, 2016).

Medical Services provided (all free of charge): (a) Prostate examination using our Ultrasound Systems; (b) assessment of prostate-specific antigens via serum samples for those up to 40 years old; (c) eye tests for diabetic retinopathy and glaucoma; (d) expert advice on diet/lifestyle in view of obesity and (e) other medical tests. Over 500 patients showed up at our 6th Medical Outreach, held for the 1st time at our own facility, JUHRI's first site, Afua. However, 307 patients received comprehensive care including free ultrasound scans, eye care, lab tests, drugs, mosquito nets, etc. Please see summary pictures above. The 17 members of the clinical team, wearing JUHRI scrubs, included Consultants in Radiology, Internal Medicine, Gynecology, Pulmonary Medicine and Specialist Optometrist. They were led by Dr Anthonia Ikpeme. They were overwhelmed by the large number of patients! We spent about N600,000 (about \$1700.00) on the 6th outreach. We recall with gratitude that you gave us permission to begin the construction of JUHRI such that the groundbreaking took place on 29th April, 2014. At the Provincial Bishops' meeting at St Joseph's Major Seminary in June 2015, as the picture below memorializes, you gave your moral and prayerful support to this endeavor to carry out our Lord's mandate to heal the sick (Matt 10:8).

Following the blessing of our Mobile Clinics by the Archbishop of Calabar, on 7th Jan. 2016, we have completed 5 medical outreaches, where we gave free ultrasound scans, free blood tests, free drugs, free eye tests/lenses, to over 1000 patients at Akpabuyo, Akamkpa, Mfamosing and Calabar so far. 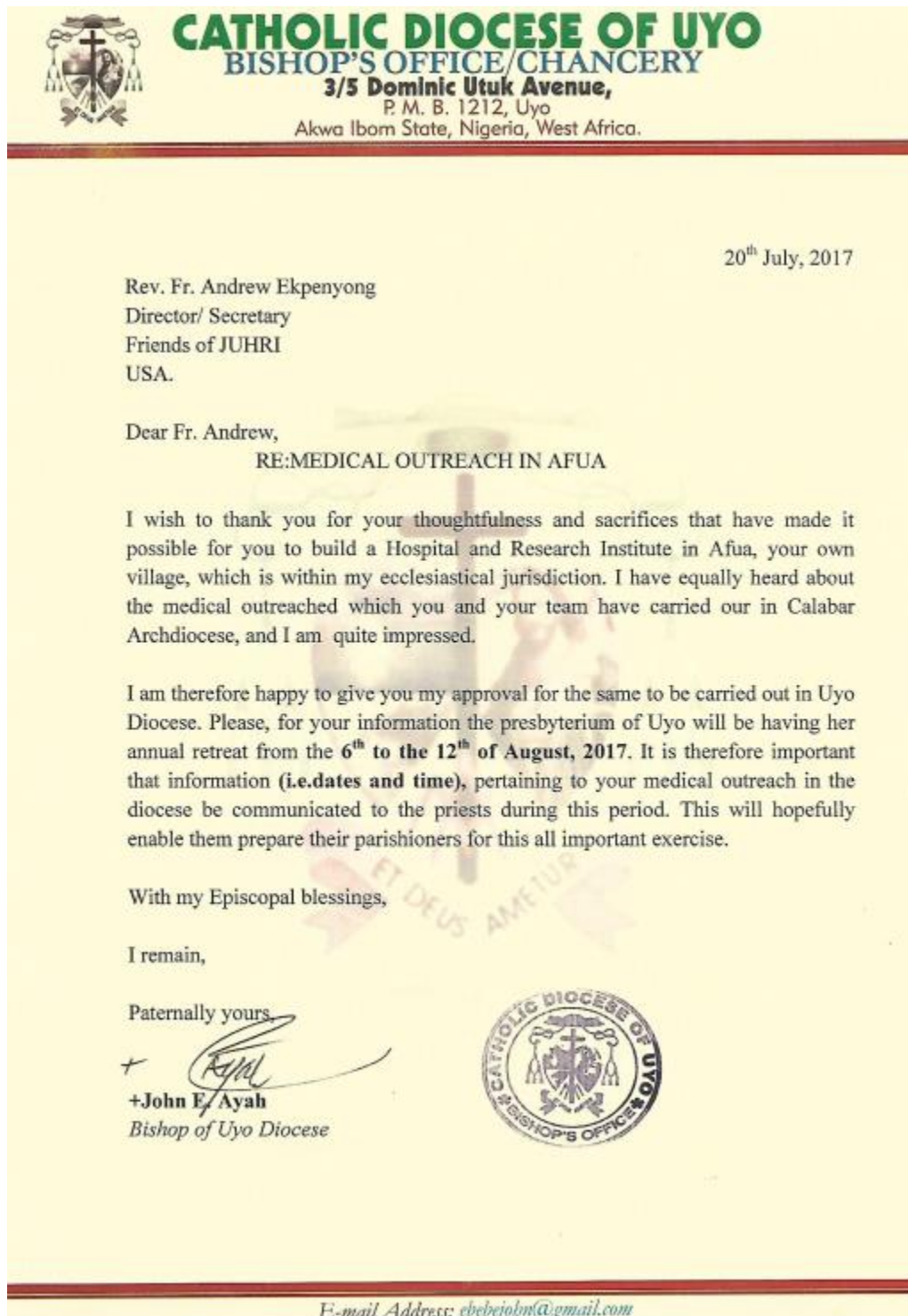

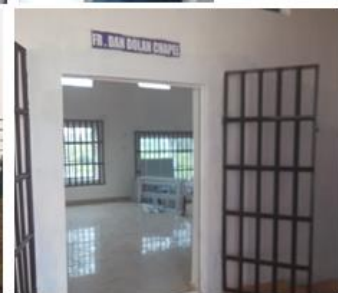

Our 40-ft container of donated medical equipment and supplies worth over \$200,000 arrived Nigeria intact and was successfully offloaded at JUHRI's 1st Site Afua on **3rd October**. Pictures with step-by-step progress are shown above. We sincerely thank all for various roles played such as earliest contact with donors (**Nicolas Maxwell**), donation and loading (**Sr Andrea, Mr Straughn & FMW**), cash donation of \$15,000 for shipment (**Archdiocese of Omaha**), representation for custom clearance (CSN, **Fr Olifedimma**), haulage and off-loading arrangements (**Fr Paul Etene, Mr William Egbe, Mr Ken Essien**) and overall oversight/advice (all our volunteering Consultant Medical Doctors: **Drs Akan Otu, Anthonia Ikpeme, Emmanuel Effa, Marcus Iyama, Victor Umoh, Boniface Ago**, etc). We spent about \$18,000 in the shipment process: (a) \$8,825 to FMW (\$4,325 shipping cost from dock to the port of Lagos, Nigeria and administration fee of \$4,500) and (b) N3.263 Million Naira (about \$9,100) to cover custom clearance, haulage, container deposit, flight to Lagos for oversight, truck towing following off-loading, etc. For detailed accounts, please see our **Dropbox**:

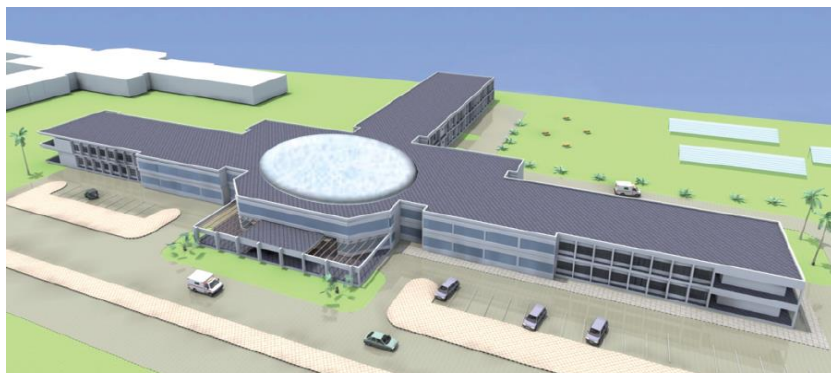
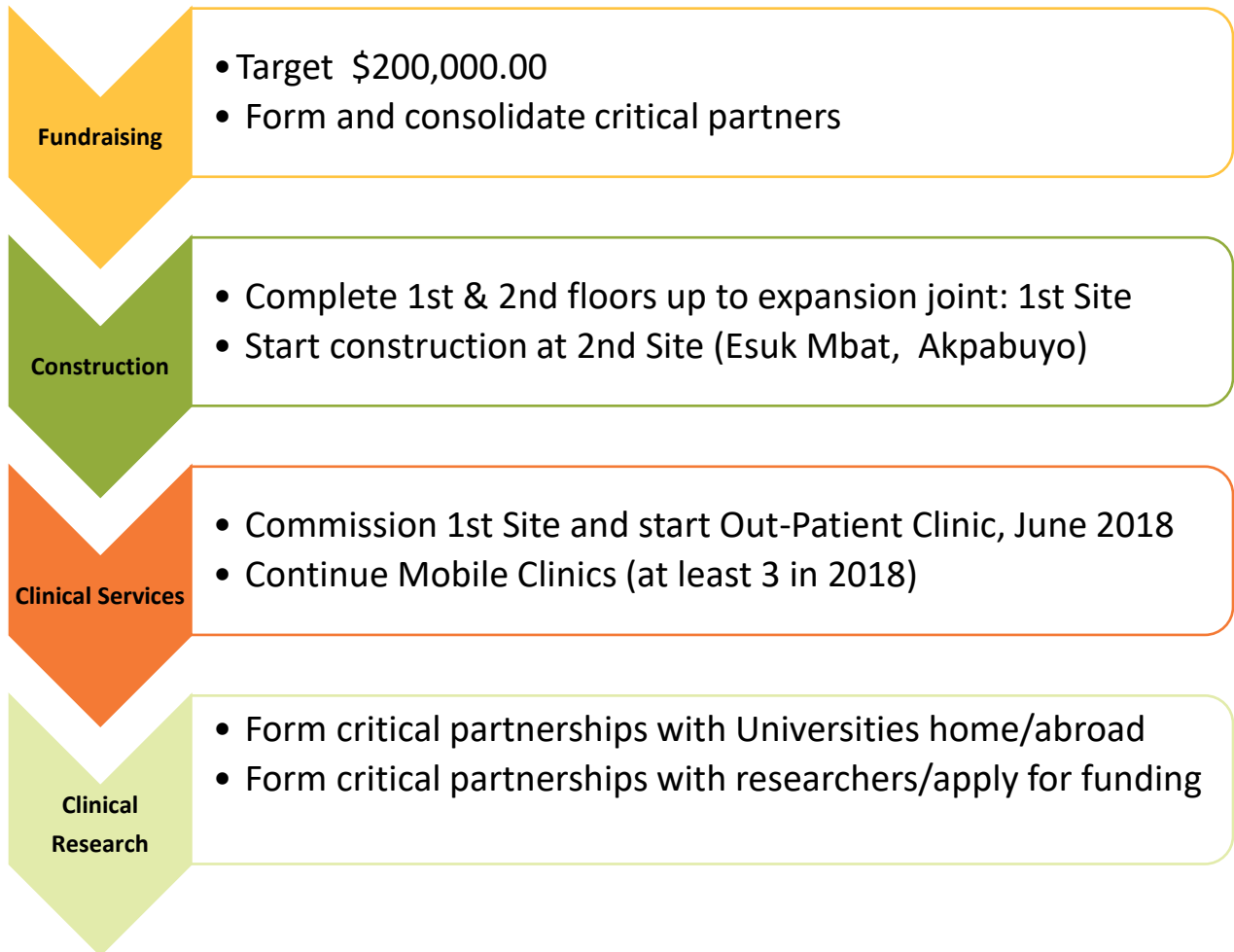
