<b>Questions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Questions check for understanding, and directly reflect notes (see Bloom's level 1 &amp; 2 or Costa's level 1).</li> <li>Questions also include Bloom's level 3–6 or Costa's level 2 &amp; 3 as appropriate.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Questions check for understanding, and directly reflect notes (see Bloom's level 1 &amp; 2 or Costa's level 1).</li> <li>Most questions are lower level in Bloom's or Costa's.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Questions are basic and may reflect notes (see Bloom's level 1 &amp; 2 or Costa's level 1).</li> <li>Most questions are lower level in Bloom's or Costa's.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Questions are limited and do not accurately reflect notes.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Questions are missing.</li> </ul>
