



California's **next** Governor will champion...



1 **100 percent clean energy, with swift implementation:** Accelerate California on the path away from fossil fuels and toward clean energy by moving toward a 100 percent clean electricity grid, zero emission transportation, electric space and water heating, and energy efficiency. Implement existing laws quickly by aligning all relevant agencies around a single vision so the state's 2030 goals are achieved and California's businesses and communities can continue to realize the economic and quality-of-life benefits that result from clean energy.



2 **Clean jobs and economic growth in communities across the state:** Drive public and private investment in energy efficiency, distributed energy resources, battery storage, and renewable energy technologies in every corner of the state. Use public dollars and mobilize new sources of private capital to sustain and scale transformative investments in local communities across California. Support and empower educators, labor, and industry to expand educational pathways for the next generation of skilled workers, including underserved communities and those transitioning out of the fossil fuel industry. Develop metrics to ensure fair distribution of benefits throughout the state.



3 **Benefits for the most disadvantaged communities and polluted neighborhoods:** Listen and respond to the concerns of California families living near fossil fuel extraction and enduring elevated levels of pollution from the fossil fuel industry. As we transition toward a clean energy future, prioritize climate investments and environmental justice for the most impacted communities, including both urban and rural neighborhoods, in order to raise the standard of living across the state and improve the overall economy.



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California climate leadership: Bolster California’s global climate leadership through climate change and clean energy commitments, smart climate investments and adaptation measures, and partnerships with cities, states, nations, businesses, universities, and community institutions. Continue spearheading a broader regional strategy around climate and clean energy in the West, strengthening alliances on regional greenhouse gas reduction programs and market expansion opportunities.



Climate-ready communities: Prepare California communities, infrastructure, and natural lands to adapt to and withstand impacts from climate change, including extreme weather, water scarcity, reduced crop yields, drought, severe wildfire, sea level rise and other climate impacts to protect our people and our economic well-being.



Zero emission transportation and new mobility options:

Establish a comprehensive vision for zero emission transportation by redesigning the state’s vehicle incentive program to improve access to zero emission vehicles (ZEV); defining a robust financing strategy for the build-out of ZEV infrastructure; and maximizing the use of available public and private funds. Support rapid advancement toward alternative transportation options and a future in which vehicles are zero emission, shared, and automated, and where advanced transportation options are available in rural and underserved communities.



A modernized electricity system: Upgrade our energy system to meet consumer needs and allow innovative technologies to thrive. Pursue a well-governed regionalized independent system operator as California looks to cement a 100 percent clean grid policy, and work to get other jurisdictions engaged in climate action; work towards a reliable, resilient grid that minimizes energy waste and securely facilitates the integrated and responsive flow of clean energy; and establish a customer first grid that unleashes innovation, drives savings, and ensures all ratepayers can access the benefits of a clean, modern grid.
