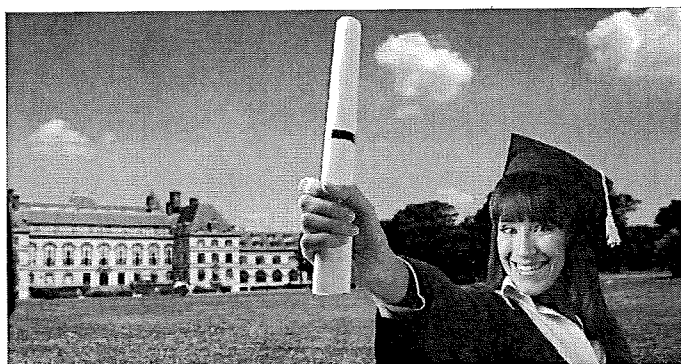

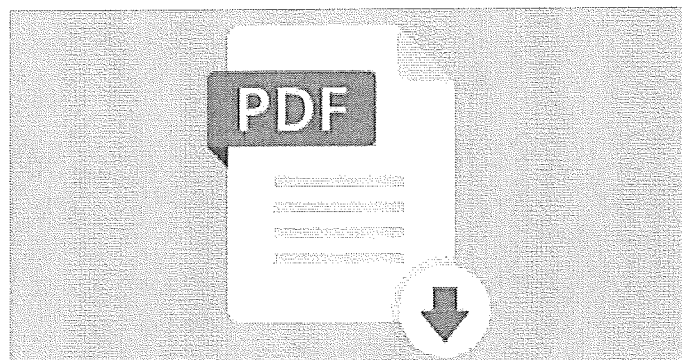

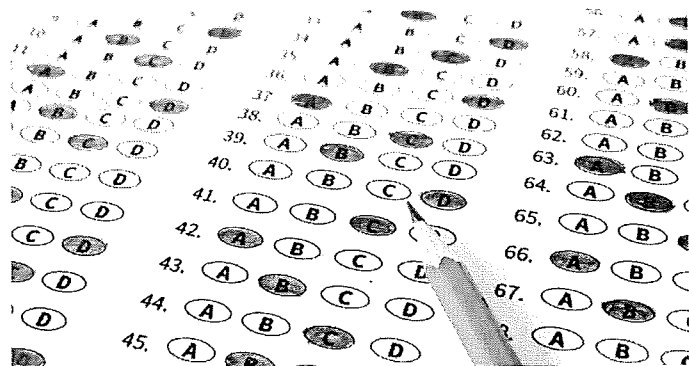

**Purpose:** This fund was established by a transfer of the Educational Trust of the Inner City Protestant Parish to the Cleveland Foundation to provide scholarship support to enable deserving individuals who are residents of Cleveland or its inner-ring suburbs to further and/or complete their formal education. Currently, the beneficiary pool is identified as high school seniors and adults to the age of 28, who are pursuing an undergraduate college degree, or

vocational/technical training. Applicants with grade-point averages between 2.0 and 3.3 on a 4.0 grade scale are given preference.

### Eligibility:

- Resident of Cleveland or its inner-ring suburbs
- High School senior or adult (up to 28 years of age) pursuing:
  - a college or university undergraduate degree on a full-time basis, or
  - enrolled in a vocational/technical certification program
- Demonstrated financial need

**Application method:** Submit a [General Application](#) and Basic Requirements through our Scholarship Gateway

**Selection process:** A selection committee composed of five individuals (including the donor advisor) will select scholarship finalists and two alternates based on the completed application. Additional criteria considered in awarding these scholarship grants include leadership, personality, motivation, special skills and interests. Preference is given to applicants with a GPA between 2.0 and 3.3 on a 4.0 grade scale.

**Award process:** The annual award amount will be based on the performance of the fund and number of applicants selected. In previous years, \$1,500 scholarships have been awarded. Formal notification of award will be made by the Cleveland Foundation to the selected recipient(s). Awards must be applied to tuition, fees, books, supplies, and equipment required for courses, and are applicable to the gap between the student's financial need and the financial aid package coordinated by the school (e.g., "last-dollar" scholarships).

### Recipient requirements:

1. Maintain full-time enrollment status
2. Submit a grade report via email for each term (min 2.0 GPA required)

Charles D. Whitmer, a business owner in Greater Cleveland, learned at an early age the value of working, saving and investing his earnings. His father encouraged him, as early as the age of 10, to save a portion of his paper route earnings. Today, his endeavors have paid off the way he had hoped. The hard work of rising at 4 a.m., loading a wagon with papers and dragging the heavy bundles through mounds of snow gave him an early business education. Saving a portion of his earnings for college and a portion to invest allows him now to

give back to the community. He wants to help those who possess the drive to do as he did: work, save, invest and hopefully help others.

The Cleveland Foundation is privileged to assist him in his goal of supporting the aspirations of others who value higher education and the work-save-invest ethic. Mr. Whitmer proved that a small savings – in his case \$1,000 – can grow into a catalyst for big dreams, as he has watched that initial amount grow to more than \$84,000, the corpus of this scholarship program. We encourage those with an entrepreneurial spirit and a commitment to complete a dream to apply.

**Purpose:** To help persons with an entrepreneurial spirit, at any age, attend – on a full-time basis – a college or university that is authorized to provide full credit toward a bachelor's or higher degree.

### Eligibility:

To be eligible, you must meet these requirements:

- Reside in Cuyahoga, Lorain, Lake or Geauga county
- Be enrolled or plan to enroll full-time in an accredited, four-year college or university

**Application method:** Submit a [General Application](#) and Basic Requirements through our Scholarship Gateway

**Specific selection criteria:** Applications should demonstrate:

- a willingness to work, save and pay for a portion of your educational expenses;
- self-motivation, self-help, initiative, good work ethic and generally embody the entrepreneurial spirit

Personal statements should address your educational plans, career goals and how this scholarship could help you meet your goals. Preference will be given to ROTC program cadets whose service leads to a commission in the United States armed forces (as tie-breaker only).

### Selection Process:

An independent selection committee appointed by the Cleveland Foundation will make recommendations on scholarship recipients. Foundation staff administers the fund and facilitates the selection process. The selection committee bases its scholarship decisions on the completed application and an evaluation of the degree to which persons meet the eligibility criteria. Consideration will also be given to compatibility of career or life goals and objectives to the educational path being pursued.

**Purpose:** To provide scholarships to graduating high school seniors from the Cleveland Metropolitan School District or its inner-ring suburbs who will be attending a qualified educational institution and meet eligibility criteria as described below: Preference to be given to African-Americans.

**Background:** Improve Consulting and Training Group was founded by Dr. Ellen Burts-Cooper in 2006. Improve Consulting and Training Group provides personal and professional development training, coaching, and

consultation. Improve works across various industries, including manufacturing, insurance, health care, financial services, academia, and information technology. In addition to working with adults, Improve spends 20 percent of its time training and developing youth and young professionals. Improve makes it a policy that revenue received from direct youth training is to be given back, in some form, to the community. The Bagby, Palmer Memorial Scholarship was founded in 2011 as a way to give back specifically to the youth in Cleveland. The scholarship was named after her mother and the mother of her husband, Selwyn Cooper. The fund was started to honor their strong belief in education as a way to transform lives and overcome difficult circumstances. Both mothers continuously stressed the power of education, but passed away before seeing Ellen and Selwyn obtain their advanced degrees. The scholarship is a way to pass on their desire for academic achievement as an opportunity for students to "improve" their lives, and "exceed their potential."

**Eligibility:** Persons who are enrolled or enrolling, **full time**, in an accredited, qualified educational institution (college, university, etc.) in undergraduate course work acceptable toward a degree, with an identifiable course focus of study in one of the STEM fields (science, technology, engineering, or math); and

- Have maintained, at least, a 3.5 cumulative high school grade-point average (4.0 scale);
- Can demonstrate consistent community service for each year of high school (a minimum of one significant project per year);
- Evidence financial need

**Application method:** Submit a [General Application](#) and Basic Requirements through our Scholarship Gateway

**Selection process:** A selection committee comprised of persons associated with the purpose of the fund will choose scholarship finalists based on the completed application packet and the degree of adherence to the eligibility criteria indicated above.

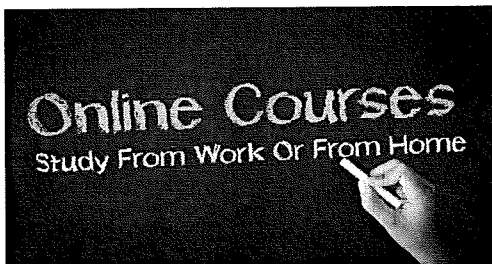

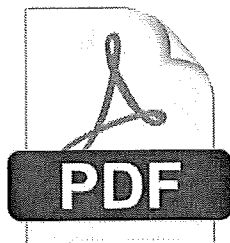
