FROM THE DEAN

As the Passion of Christ draws near, today's readings challenge us to be more passionate in our worship, in our faith and in our devotion to Christ.

In Isaiah, the emphasis is on worship. The Israelites are called once again to be the people God made them to be, 'so that they might declare the praises of God'.

In Philippians, the emphasis is on faith. Paul celebrates the righteousness that comes through faith in Christ and challenges us to keep on growing as that faith matures.

In John, Mary's passionate act of anointing Jesus' feet is both a sign of his burial and an inspiration for him – and for us – to wash the feet of others.

The passages crystallise a question with which the Christian worshipper must wrestle.

Is Christianity at heart about helping others, meeting the needs of the poor, being a good neighbour, and doing one's part to make the world a better place? Or is it at heart about paying devotion to Jesus, showing extravagant love and costly sacrifice to him, despite this seeming over-the-top to the world?
