FROM THE DEAN

This Sunday as we celebrate Pentecost we are reminded that the Spirit's coming has cosmic consequences. People from all places and all times gathered on that day according to Acts. People from all walks of life, live around us, work with us, and might even enter our spaces of worship. The Spirit sent to us by God is hovering, ready to unleash its saving power on all people.
