- *Being a worshipping Christian community that takes seriously reconciliation in Christ and seeks to gain greater understanding of our faith*
- *Seeking to provide loving service to God's people and God's world*
- *Building a sense of community where the gifts of each member are celebrated and there is support for the needs of each*

We have identified the following priority areas to meet the challenges of our vision:

- Resourcing – Physical and Financial
- Connecting with Diocese, City, Ecumenically, Missionally
- Ministry – Parish, Children, Youth, Families, Elderly, Pastoral Care, Christian Formation

baby Jesus to God in the Temple at Jerusalem. Candles are also blessed with holy water and incense as representations of Christ the Light.

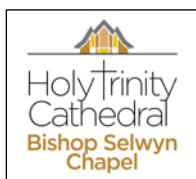
WASTING TIME WITH GOD
