# 9 June 2019 THE DAY OF PENTECOST TE RÃ O TE PETEKOHA

#### FROM THE DEAN

Pentecost was originally a Jewish harvest festival, celebrated 50 days after Passover, and came to commemorate Moses receiving the Law from God. As Pentecost approaches, the disciples are feeling very uncertain, suspended between Jesus' death and the coming of the Holy Spirit. Jesus has promised to send an 'advocate' or 'helper' (John 14.26) and the disciples are nervously waiting. They lack confidence because they have lost their leader. Their senses are intensified, and their expectations are high, but they don't know what to do. It is not a rational earthly experience that resolves their wait, but a heavenly one.

Henri Nouwen writes in Eternal Seasons, "Pentecost is a dramatic moment in the liturgical year when the Spirit of god 'aflame with his fire', fills the universe and tells of a new heaven and a new earth. Fifty days after Easter, the Spirit showers down on the apostles, signifying the birth of the Church and salvation for all in Jesus Christ. Whitsunday inaugurates a season of joy, hope and mission, a time when the Church comes 'alive with a new breath'. These quotations written by a Benedictine monk give a sense of the energy and passion released at Pentecost, signifying not only an historical event or a revealed truth but a spiritual reality."
