FROM THE DEAN

In his book You Are What You Love James K. A. Smith writes, What do you want?

It is the first, last, and most fundamental question of Christian discipleship. In the Gospel of John, it is the first question Jesus poses to those who would follow him. When two would-be disciples who are caught up in John the Baptist's enthusiasm begin to follow, Jesus wheels around on them and pointedly asks, "what do you want?" (John 1:38).

It is the question that is buried under almost every other question Jesus asks each of us. "Will you come and follow me?" "Do you love me?"

Jesus doesn't encounter Matthew and John – or you and me – and ask, "What do you know? He doesn't even ask, "What do you believe?" He asks, "What do you want?" This is the most incisive, piercing question Jesus can ask of us precisely because we are what we want. Our wants and longings and desires are at the core of our identity, the wellspring from which our actions and behaviour flow. Our wants reverberate from our heart, the epicentre of the human person. Thus, Scripture counsels, "Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it" (Proverbs 4:23). Discipleship, we might say, is a way to curate your heart, to be attentive to and intentional about what you love."
