TE RĀTAPU TEKAU MĀ RIMA O HE WĀ NOA IHO**

FROM THE DEAN

Today's Gospel deliberately skirts around the feeding of the 5000, of which we shall read next week as John tells us. Its significance this week lies in the opening words: 'The apostles.' Those Jesus had sent out to teach and heal had been described simply as 'the twelve'; John's followers are described as disciples (Mark 6.29); but the returning twelve have earned this new title. The name 'apostles' may be somewhat premature, but it marks the transition from learning by listening, to the point where they can report on their first practical experience of bearing the good news in word and deed. The distinction will be important to every Christian. Paul would say (Romans 2.13) 'it is not the hearers of the law who are righteous in God's sight, but the doers of the law who will be justified' and James (1.22) encourages his hearers to 'be doers of the word.'

Discipleship involves being invited into the mission of Christ to develop a new human community in which divisions between us are broken down. This is a very different, supra-human form of community, a community centred on Christ. This mission begins with a sense of being called by Jesus and sent out, to learn by doing. It can cost lives and time is short, so it is important to seize God's moment and act. However, we need power and support in this mission, so Christ gathers us back, to tell the stories and support each other, and this shapes the rhythm of our worship as we offer ourselves, our sense of calling, and God's mission to God in worship.

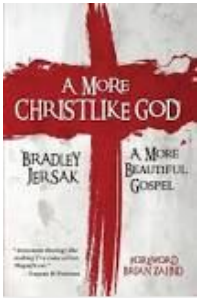

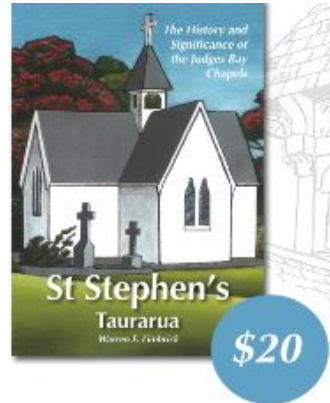
