2 June 2019 SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER TE RĀTAPU TUARIMA O TE ARANGA

FROM THE DEAN

Looking at this week's readings, in the first instance, Acts 16 brings together two stories of dramatic release. A Philippian slave-girl is released from the internal prison of clairvoyance and Paul and Silas are literally released from prison. Both incidents involve power struggles. In the power struggle between Paul and the slave-girl's exploitative owners, the girl loses her 'usefulness' as she is no longer able to earn money through fortune-telling, but she regains her true self. In the power struggle with the local Roman authorities, Paul and Silas are imprisoned for causing a disturbance, but an earthquake (a sign of divine intervention) frees them from captivity. The jailer, saved from suicide by faith, is baptized along with his family.

In the Gospel reading, John 17, having first prayed for his disciples before he leaves them, Jesus then prays that his heavenly Father will unify his followers to come - 'that they may all be one' (v.21). Jesus knows that his disciples will need the support of their community in the challenges ahead, as will future generations of believers.

Paul and Silas understand Jesus' way. Their faith in God is not dependent on their release from prison. They are praying and singing hymns to God in prison before they know they will be released, so their praise is not dependent on them being rescued.

How do we react when we are in a dark place?

And so, we pray:

May the love of God free you to live with confidence, the example of a 'Jesusfree you' to serve those in need. May the power of the Holy Spirit help you overcome all that would darken the world. Amen.
