FROM THE DEAN

We have had a letter from Bishop Ross regarding the Diocesan plans for another Indaba process. Indaba 1 was aimed at networking diverse groups across the Diocese. The Cathedral was linked with the Ministry Units of St Luke's, Manurewa and Bream Bay LSMU.

This time, with Indaba 2, all Ministry Units have been linked with a network of neighbouring Ministry Units. The Cathedral has been linked with St Barnabas Mt Eden, Telugu Mission District, Asian Mission Districts and Waiheke Mission District. We are asked to engage with these Ministry Units between now and Advent.

It is suggested that the focus be on reciprocal Sunday worship visits, preceded by a gathering the week before of representatives of each Ministry Unit involved. The hope is that we will get to know our neighbours more and maybe develop an ongoing relationship as we work together in the mission of God.
