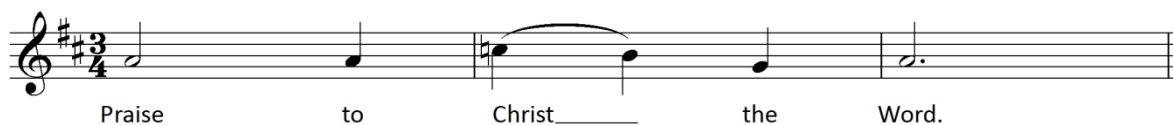

The Great Thanksgiving

It is our custom to stand throughout the following prayer, as you are able.

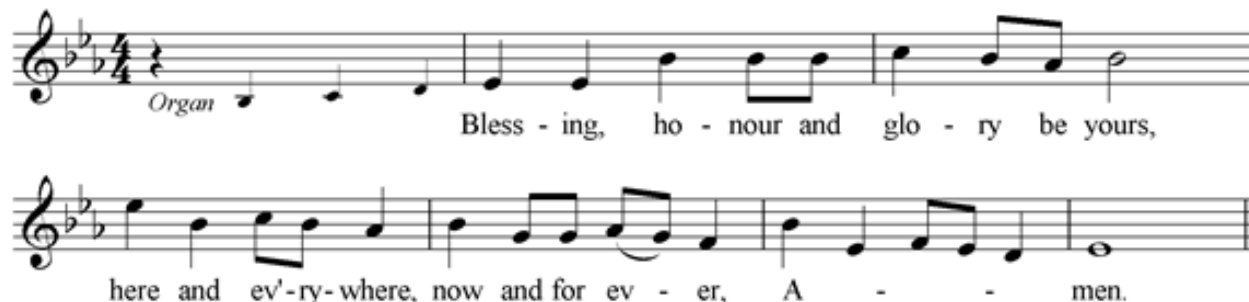
Blessed are you, most holy, in your Son;

The Invitation

Come God's people, come to receive Christ's heavenly food.

All those who are baptised are welcome to receive the Holy Communion.

For reasons of hygiene we encourage drinking from the chalice. Dipping the wafer in the wine (intincting) is not allowed.

You are welcome to receive Communion in only one kind if you wish – the bread only.

Please indicate to the administrant if you would prefer a gluten-free wafer.

If you wish to receive a blessing only, please fold your arms across your chest.

When young children come to Communion with their parents, their parents' consent will be sought before they are offered Communion.
