FROM THE CURATE



Today we find ourselves one week from Easter Sunday, a day we celebrate the hope, joy and promise of Christ's resurrection life. Yet, one week into Eastertide, we share the pain and sorrow of our Christian Sri Lankan sisters and brothers who were targeted during their Easter services.

Another act of terrorism feels almost too much to bear as we are still reeling after the attacks on Christchurch mosques last month. However, these attacks present an opportunity for all of us to grasp more tightly to the radical teachings that ultimately led Jesus to the cross but also that point us to the participation in the establishment of God's peace on earth.

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"
Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.'

In the midst of such hatred in our world right now, how can we follow Jesus' way of love? Acts of extremism follow the same pattern of evil all around the world, regardless of one's personal conviction or belief. As neighbours, be it Christians, Muslims, Jews or people of any other or no faith, we can affirm in the act of friendship and our common humanity, to choose love over the perpetuation of hatred. Where acts of terror have sought to divide us, let us instead be bold witnesses to God's peace and in God's love that has the power to overcome death.

Love demands more than tolerance. It calls us to embrace the other, in spite of our differences. If we do not understand this, we will not only miss an engagement with people of other faiths, but we will also miss the deeper meaning of the message of reconciliation and witness for the common good.

In the days after Easter, many of our Muslim friends called us to express their sorrow and sympathy – let us share in those sentiments and journey together.


