FROM THE DEAN

This week I offer some more helpful information which comes from a Ministry of Health Publication and can also be found online:

"You don't seem to be yourself lately", "Can we talk".

Showing one or more of the following warning signs doesn't mean a person is suicidal but its likely they need your support.

You might notice they:

Read or write about suicide online or post images about suicide

- Become obsessed with death
- Become isolated from family/whānau and friends
- Tell you they want to die or kill themselves
- Have changes in mood easily angered or enraged and depressed
- Feel worthless, guilty, whakama or ashamed
- Use drugs or alcohol to cope with difficult feelings or thoughts
- Sleep a lot more than usual, or stop getting enough sleep
- Give away possessions, pay back debts or 'tie up loose ends'
- Stop taking their medication
- Suddenly seem calm or happy after they have been depressed or suicidal

Not everyone shows these signs, and some are not obvious, as suicidal people may pretend things are okay.

If you think that someone might be at risk, pay attention to changes in their behaviour. Trust your instinct and ask them directly if they are thinking about suicide.

How to help if you are concerned about someone.:

Call your local mental health assessment team.

Go with them to the nearest hospital's Emergency Department

Call 111 if they are in immediate danger to themselves or others.

Stay with them until support arrives and remove any obvious means of suicide they may use. (car keys, rope, pills, knives guns etc.)

Make sure you are safe. Stay calm and let them know you care.
