#### FROM THE DEAN:

To Our Children's Children is a 1969 album by The Moody Blues. The title alone should be enough to make us pause and take stock of how we live, and how we nurture generations to come. Many of us during the Covid lockdown and beyond had time to stop and think. There has been little choice! For those who have not had to worry about job or income loss or staff wellbeing the spare time and resulting headspace has allowed a re-evaluation of our frantic, consumeristic, individualistic, self-sufficient lives. Maybe you like me have completed a mental debrief and if you have not you might find it helpful to do so. It might look like this:

What kind of future would I like to return to?

What was working before?

Who was 'before' working for?

Was before working?

Access, poverty, isolation, climate crisis, housing, food poverty are all areas that in my mind could do with innovation and courageous thinking.

Re-imagining what our society could be is an opportunity we cannot miss as a faith community. Beyond economic recovery, how can we think creatively about reviewing and developing our future?

These last few months has not been an easy time, and the turmoil and confusion will continue. But maybe, just maybe, lasting good can come from this Great Pause – for us and the generations to come.
