#### FROM THE PRECENTOR

The prayer rhythm of the Church is something that gives all of us, as a community, an inner sense of who we are. We are not a club, we are not just a fellowship of jolly great people, we are not a self-organised charity with aims only related with the world. Each time the Church comes together to worship, we recognise in our gathering not our action, but the action of God who invites us together. Hence, every work of God's people, liturgy, has its purpose in our response to God. The central act of our worship is the Eucharist, when under the sacramental signs of bread and wine we recognise the real presence of the one who said: "This is my body...this is my blood....I am the bread of life..."

The services/Liturgies of the Eucharist are an ordinary part of our New Zealand Prayer Book/He Karakia Mihinare o Aotearoa. Our Church was enriched this year with a new edition of the Liturgies of the Eucharist. You may have already noticed that, in our Orders of service, our Great Thanksgivings (central parts of the Eucharist) look slightly different. This is all in accordance with the new edition of this important liturgical book, that introduced (apart from our standard four main liturgies) eight new Great Thanksgivings for various pastoral use. This new edition was presented and commended to all of us, who were participating at the Diocesan Ministry Conference last week. The Diocese has made sure that at least one copy reaches each ministry unit in our Diocese.

As a Precentor, I am in love with the liturgy – this is the core of my ministry here. From my point of view, the alternative Great Thanksgivings offer something that can be very helpful – familiarity with the liturgy. Though our Prayer Book offers a wide variety of, sometimes complicated variations, it is the intention that the responses during the Great Thanksgiving become so familiar, that we can respond to them by heart. From the initial dialogue, to Sanctus, "Glory to you..." and "Blessing, honour..." liturgical responses are drawing us deeper into full participation in the liturgy.

One less fortunate feature of unfamiliar texts is that we have to read every word from the service sheet. I deeply wish and urge all to take the words of the liturgy, especially The Great Thanksgiving, close to your hearts. Being drawn deeper into the mysteries we celebrate by leaving the sheets aside, and participating in a fuller way, if you can, by listening and responding to the said word. In that way, your focus will be on what really happens at the altar and not on the sheet in front of you.

The new copies of this book can be ordered from the office of General Synod. May all of us pray together and see Christ in these mysteries and in each other. Fr Ivica, *Cathedral Precentor*
