you as just a weed.



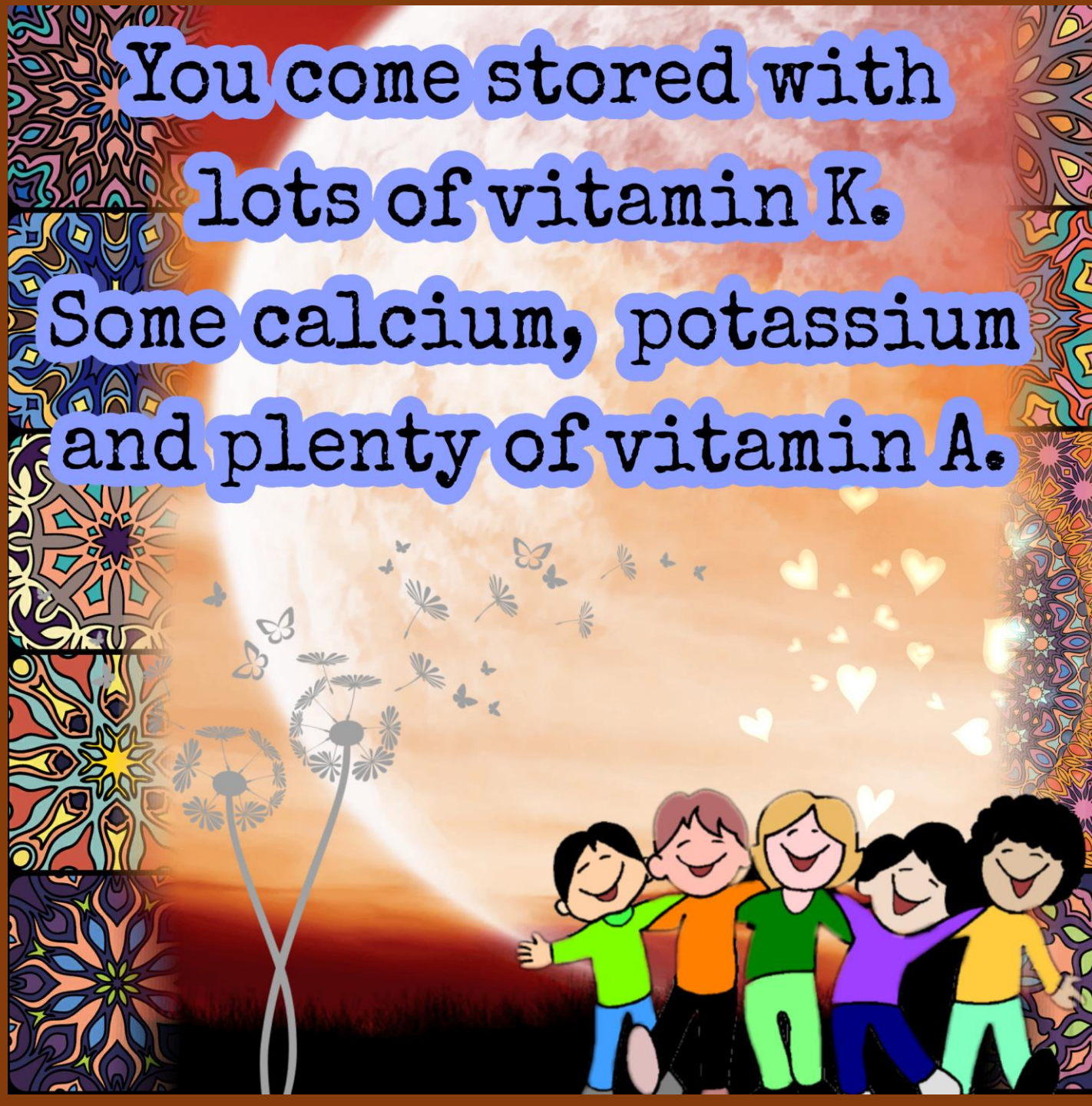
You wake up
